July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020: 12 Months in Review

Where Public Defender Recovery Coaches Operate

Six recovery coaches and one treatment coordinator work across 25 counties in West Virginia:

- 1st and 2nd Judicial Circuits: Brooke, Hancock, Ohio, Marshall, Tyler, and Wetzel Counties.
- 4th Judicial Circuit (Treatment Coordinator): Wood and Wirt Counties.
- 5th and 28th Judicial Circuits: Jackson, Roane, Calhoun and Nicholas Counties.
- 6th, 24th, and 25th Judicial Circuits: Cabell, Wayne, Boone and Lincoln Counties.
- 7th, 8th, and 30th Judicial Circuits: Logan, McDowell, and Mingo Counties.
- 10th, 11th, and 12th Judicial Circuits: Raleigh, Fayette, Greenbrier and Pocahontas Counties.
- 15th and 18th Judicial Circuits: Harrison and Preston Counties.

Public Defender Recovery Coaches contact defendants and intervene at the earliest stage after entrance into the criminal legal system: shortly after legal appointment is made.

Initial Intake Data



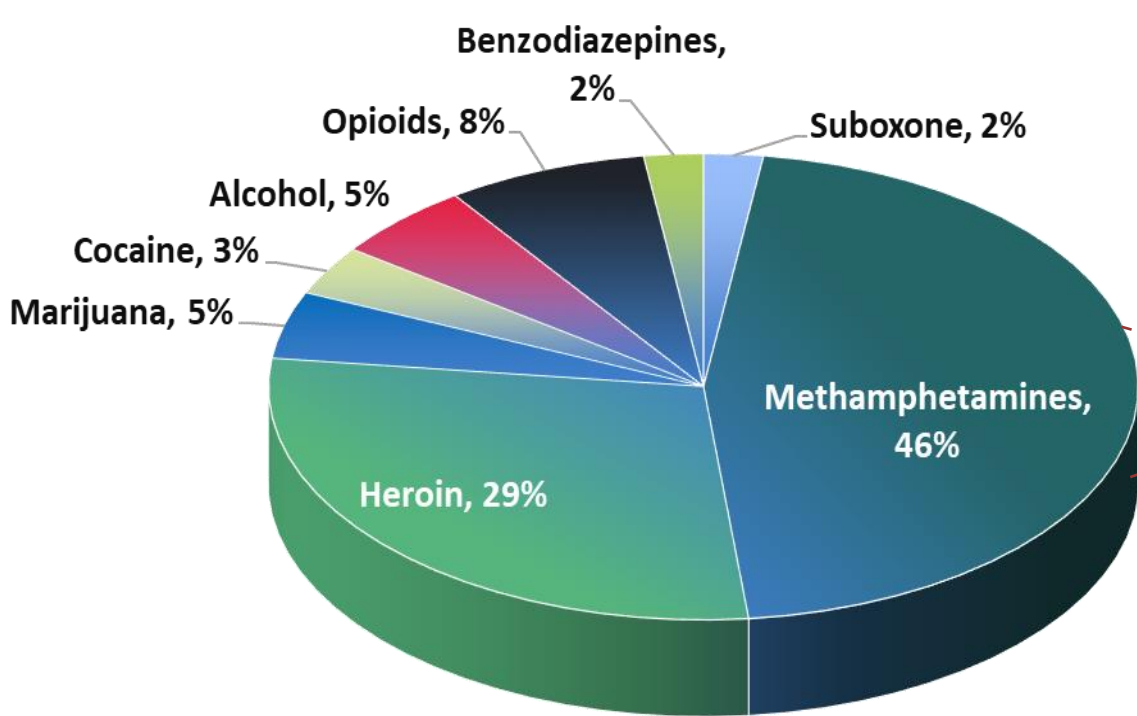
The **Recovery Capital Scale** is a tool to measure a person's recovery capacity (the resources, strengths, and willingness that person brings with them into the treatment process). The maximum score is 175 points and the higher the Recovery Capital Scale score the better chances for success in treatment and long-term sobriety.

Clients Reporting Substance of Choice



Overall, 35% of respondents at intake reported methamphetamine use in combination with another substance, increasing overdose risk.

Upon 6-Month Follow Up...



Compared to 109 (avg.) at intake; an 18% increase.

The Public Defender Corporation Recovery Coach Project intervenes into the lives of substance using criminal defendants to reduce overdose risk and risk for reoffending by identifying and linking them to treatment at the earliest stage of the criminal justice process. ¹ Of the 842 referrals, there is limited data for 390 clients, or 46% of those referred to recovery coaches. Approximately 33% of the overall number of clients referred did not receive any services due to non-response (such as lack of client interest or case resolution). Those who fall within that 13% difference are included in the data wherever applicable.

² Based on 457 intakes.

³ 33% of those who entered treatment completed treatment.

⁴ Based on 45 responses; many follow-ups occurred during the pandemic.

⁵ 41% of our results were unknown for rearrests.
