# WV REENTRY GUIDE

## WHAT TO DO LEADING UP TO & AFTER RELEASE FROM JAIL/PRISON

#### PREPARING FOR RELEASE

- □ Learn about the release process and make a release plan for:
  - □ transportation from jail or prison
  - □ taking your property with you
  - $\Box$  clothing for your release
- □ Keep a folder with all release paperwork and documents

#### IMPORTANT TOOLS FOR SUCCESSFUL REENTRY

- □ Get a library card
- □ Get a public transportation card (not sure what the system is in WV)
- Get a cell phone and phone number and set up your voicemail
- □ Get a postal mailing address
- □ Create an email address

#### LEGAL PROTECTIONS FOR PEOPLE WITH CRIMINAL RECORDS

- Make sure your criminal record is accurate
- □ Seal your criminal record if you are eligible
- Learn about your legal rights when seeking a job, applying for an occupational license, and looking for housing

#### PROBATION, PAROLE, AND SUPERVISED RELEASE

- Find out what type of supervision you are on and know your conditions of release and supervision
- □ Report to supervision
- Obtain contact information for your community supervision officer
- Establish rapport and maintain contact with your community supervision officer
- Refrain from drug use and obey all laws
- □ Maintain verifiable housing
- □ Maintain verifiable employment
- Report for scheduled office visits and drug testing

#### IDENTITY DOCUMENTS AND PERSONAL RECORDS

- □ Keep your photo ID and all release paperwork
- □ Get a drivers license or non-driver identification card
- □ Apply for a US passport
- □ Request military discharge papers
- □ Obtain arrest, jail, and court records
- Obtain education records from your time in prison
- □ Obtain social security card
- Obtain birth certificate

#### TRANSPORTATION

- Look for subsidies for public transportation
- □ Use public transportation
- □ Consider rideshare options

#### HOUSING

- □ Identify housing options:
  - □ Connect with family and friends
  - Look into pre-release transfer to a halfway house or home confinement
  - Look into day programs and drop-in centers, shelters, transitional shelters, single room occupancy, supportive housing
  - Consider public vs affordable vs private housing options
- □ Learn about utility assistance and internet services (LIHEAP)

#### FAMILY CONNECTIONS AND LEGAL RIGHTS

- Learn about child custody and visitation
  - Submit motion to modify your current custody agreement
- □ Find out if you owe child support
  - □ Suspend or modify child support
- □ File for divorce
  - □ Get support to get out of unhealthy relationships

#### HEALTHCARE

- □ Learn about health insurance options
  - Medicaid income based
  - Medicare If you are over 65 years of age or receiving Social Security Disability Insurance payments
- Learn about accessing healthcare without insurance - Community Health Clinics/Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)
- Find out how you will get any medications you've been receiving
- Learn about cost differences between emergency and clinic care
- □ Find support for healing from trauma
- Find behavioral health support for mental health and/or substance use

#### PUBLIC BENEFITS

- □ Apply for Social Security Disability Benefits (SSI/SSDI)
- Apply for Interim Disability Assistance (IDA)
- □ Apply for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- □ Apply for WV WORKS (West Virginias TANF)
- Apply for the Women, Infants, and Children program (WIC)
- Resume Veterans Administration (VA)
  Benefits

#### EMPLOYMENT

- □ Prepare for the job market
  - □ Collect necessary identification
  - Prepare a resume
  - Know your legal rights in regards to employment
  - Learn about technology in the workplace
- Consider an apprenticeship, job training program, higher education, or entrepreneurship
- Learn about the Work Opportunity Tax Credit and Federal Bonding

### EDUCATION

- □ Learn about educational opportunities:
  - Adult Basic Education (ABE) and
    Workforce Development
  - □ High School Diploma, GED, NEPD
  - Trade Schools, Apprenticeships, and College
  - $\Box$  Jobs and Hope

## VOTING AND CIVIC PARTICIPATION

Register to vote (different processes if you're incarcerated vs in the community)

### FINANCES

- $\Box$  Open a bank account
- $\Box$  Check your credit score
- □ Apply for a credit card
- Find out what fines and fees you may still owe to the court (either through your supervision officer or by contacting the clerk of the court)

#### GUNS, SEX OFFENDER, AND OTHER REGISTRIES

- □ Know your rights about gun ownership
- ☐ If applicable, register for sex offender or child abuse registries
