

30 YEARS: 1989 - 2019

Panel Attorneys and Public Defenders have represented indigent persons for decades in West Virginia. The first Public Defender Corporation was activated in 1983, and 18 public defender corporations are now operational across 30 WV counties.



Indigent Defense Over the Years

Public Defender Services was formally created by the West Virginia State Legislature in 1989 with the purpose of developing and improving programs of legal representation for indigent persons through panel attorneys and public defender corporations.


1963

United States Supreme Court Decision, *Gideon v. Wainwright*, 372 U.S. 335, 83 S.Ct. 792, 9 L.Ed.2d 799 (indigent defendants have a right to counsel).



1976

1976: *State ex rel. Partain v. Oakley*, 159 W.Va. 805, 227 S.E.2d 314 (inadequacies and potential unreliability of the indigent defense system requires remedial action “left to the Legislature of the State”).



1981

Legislature established Public Legal Services in Code [§ 29-21-1, et seq., (1989)]. (The legislature funded only a few offices with most judicial circuits relying on appointment of private practitioners for indigent defense work.)



1989

New legislation (1) amends public legal services and creates Public Defender Services whose “principal purpose [is] the development and improvement of programs [to provide] legal representation to indigent persons.”; and (2) continues public defender corporations and panel attorneys, creates the Appellate Advocacy Division.

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S PAGE



Public Defender Services' annual report for the State of West Virginia's Fiscal Year 2018 – 2019 ("FY2019") is being produced noticeably later than traditionally done. The agency's goal is to have an annual report completed before commencement of the next legislative session. The retirement of certain personnel, the medical and family emergencies of other personnel, the aging and the deterioration of certain software, and the revisions to the electronic system conspired to make the detailed computations contained within the agency's reports difficult to generate. However, through the perseverance of dedicated personnel, the assistance of non-agency personnel, and the determination of leaders within the agency, the annual report is finally completed, albeit after the adjournment of the 2020 and 2021 legislative sessions.

FY2019 was most notable for the success of sustained efforts to improve the state's system of indigent defense. For the first time in thirty years, the rates of compensation for the private attorneys taking court appointments were increased by one-third, which required the Legislature's and Governor Justice's commitment to between five and seven million dollars in additional funding. Also, compensation for paralegal services was set at a rate of twenty dollars, rather than based on a reimbursement of the salary paid for such services capped at twenty dollars. The rates became effective July 1, 2019.

And, for the first time, the agency's guidelines for billing were embodied in a legislative rule that could be printed and used as a guide. And, for the first time, the agency will be operating a habeas corpus division to alleviate the unmet need for private counsel to take these demanding appointments. And, for the first time, attorneys can submit invoices electronically to the agency for approval and processing without the need for judicial review unless a dispute arises. Some court orders are still required, however, but the result is a potentially paperless submission and, hopefully, quicker processing. With respect to the "quicker processing," the agency's technological issues with the voucher system and the issues with personnel have substantially hobbled the pace of processing. However, the agency is committed to working on the issues, resolving the problems, and achieving a goal of compensating attorneys very shortly after submission of a voucher.

And, for the first time, the agency implemented a program to enable clients of public defender corporations to receive treatment for their substance use issues at the earliest point of intersection with the criminal justice system. This was accomplished by embedding recovery coaches in the corporations. Going forward, the agency is hoping to obtain more funding so that this program can be available to all indigent defendants struggling with a substance use disorder.

So, FY2019 was, in greatest part, about making strides that would strengthen the state's indigent defense services in the following years. The agency will now focus on providing training to attorneys and implementing programs for the holistic representation of clients by their counsel.

PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICES Historical Overview

1. The State of West Virginia's Constitutional Obligation.

Over fifty years ago, the Supreme Court of the United States recognized that:

[R]eason and reflection require us to recognize that in our adversary system of criminal justice, any person haled into court, who is too poor to hire a lawyer, cannot be assured a fair trial unless counsel is provided for him. This seems to us to be an obvious truth. Governments, both state and federal, quite properly spend vast sums of money to establish machinery to try defendants accused of crime. Lawyers to prosecute are everywhere deemed essential to protect the public's interest in an orderly society. ... The right of one charged with crime to counsel may not be deemed fundamental and essential to fair trials in some countries, but it is in ours. From the very beginning, our state and national constitutions and laws have laid great emphasis on procedural and substantive safeguards designed to assure fair trials before impartial tribunals in which every defendant stands equal before the law. This noble idea cannot be realized if the poor man charged with crime has to face his accusers without a lawyer to assist him.

Gideon v. Wainwright, 372 U.S. 335, 344, 83 S.Ct. 792 (1963). With this decision, the Supreme Court of the United States, through the Fourteenth Amendment, extended the Sixth Amendment guarantee of the assistance of counsel in criminal prosecutions to the states. Essentially, states had to provide counsel for persons who were too poor to pay for legal services when these persons were confronted with criminal charges or the loss of other important rights by reason of state action.

The Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia reaffirmed this constitutional mandate as follows:

“There can be no equal justice where the kind of trial a man gets depends on the amount of money he has. ...” *Griffin v. Illinois*, 351 U.S. 12, 76 S.Ct. 585, 100 L.Ed. 891 (1956). ... The state must, as a matter of equal protection, provide indigents with the basic tools for an adequate defense or appeal, when those tools are available for a price to others.

State v. England, 363 S.E.2d 725, 727 (W. Va. 1987). Accordingly, a defense must be provided to indigent defendants and the defense must include not only the services of the attorney, but the provision of other services and material, including the transcripts of proceedings. *Id.*

2. The Legislative Findings.

In 1981, the following was codified at W. Va. Code §29-21-1:

The Legislature finds and declares that in certain proceedings the state is required to provide high quality legal assistance to indigent persons who would be otherwise unable to afford adequate legal counsel; that providing legal representation to those who face an economic barrier to adequate legal counsel will serve the ends of justice in accordance with rights and privileges guaranteed to all citizens by the Constitution of the United States of America and the constitution of the state of West Virginia; that the availability of quality legal assistance reaffirms the faith of our citizens in our government of laws; that the present system which utilizes appointed counsel is not operating satisfactorily in some areas of this state and the Legislature is presently unable to determine what system or systems will provide the most efficient means for providing legal representation; that there is a need to explore alternative methods of delivering legal assistance, including the use of salaried public defenders complemented by private panel attorneys; that innovative programs and pilot projects as well as a continuation of the present appointed counsel system are necessary in separate areas of the state to provide information and experience upon which to base future legislative action.

The West Virginia Public Legal Services Council was then created “for the purpose of facilitating required legal representation of indigent persons”. W. Va. Code §29-21-3 (1981; superseded in 1989).

In 1989, the agency was renamed as Public Defender Services and was charged as follows:

The agency shall have as its principal purpose the development and improvement of programs by which the state provides legal representation to indigent persons.

W. Va. Code §29-21-4. This remains the agency’s charge.

PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICES

An Organizational Overview

VISION: *"There can be no equal justice where the kind of trial a man gets depends on the amount of money he has." Griffin v. Illinois, 351 U.S. 12 (1956)*

MISSION STATEMENT: To fulfill the State of West Virginia's constitutional obligation to provide quality legal assistance to persons who otherwise could not afford legal counsel in proceedings in which the person's liberty interests are at stake.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE:

Public Defender Services is within the Department of Administration for the State of West Virginia. The chief administrative officer is the Executive Director, who is appointed by the governor.

In addition to its administrative staff, the agency has five divisions.

The Accounting and Auditing Division is charged with the following responsibilities:

The agency shall establish and the executive director or his or her designee shall operate an accounting and auditing division to require and monitor the compliance with this article by public defender corporations and other persons or entities receiving funding or compensation from the agency. The accounting and auditing division shall review all plans and proposals for grants and contracts and shall make a recommendation of approval or disapproval to the executive director. The accounting and auditing division shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, reports concerning the evaluation, inspection or monitoring of public defender corporations and other grantees, contractors, persons or entities receiving financial assistance under this article and shall further carry out the agency's responsibilities for records and reports as set forth in section eighteen of this article. The accounting and auditing division shall require each public defender corporation to submit financial statements monthly and to report monthly on the billable and nonbillable time of its professional employees, including time used in administration of the respective offices, so as to compare the time to similar time expended in nonpublic law offices for similar activities. The accounting and auditing division shall provide to the executive director assistance in the fiscal administration of all of the agency's divisions. This assistance shall include, but not be limited to, budget preparation and statistical analysis.

W. Va. Code §29-21-6(d).

The Criminal Law Research Center is another division of the agency and has the following statutory charge:

- (1) Undertake research, studies and analyses and act as a central repository, clearinghouse and disseminator of research materials;
- (2) Prepare and distribute a criminal law manual and other materials and establish and implement standard and specialized training programs for attorneys practicing criminal law;
- (3) Provide and coordinate continuing legal education programs and services for attorneys practicing criminal law; and
- (4) Prepare, supplement and disseminate indices and digests of decisions of the West Virginia supreme court of appeals and other courts, statutes and other legal authorities relating to criminal law.

W. Va. Code §29-21-7.

The agency's third division, the Appellate Advocacy Division is established as follows:

The agency shall establish and the executive director or his or her designee shall operate an appellate advocacy division for the purpose of prosecuting litigation on behalf of eligible clients in the Supreme Court of Appeals. The executive director or his or her designee shall be the director of the appellate advocacy division. The appellate advocacy division shall represent eligible clients upon appointment by the circuit courts or by the Supreme Court of Appeals. The division may, however, refuse the appointments due to a conflict of interest or if the executive director has determined the existing caseload cannot be increased without jeopardizing the appellate division's ability to provide effective representation. In order to effectively and efficiently use the resources of the appellate division, the executive director may restrict the provision of appellate representation to certain types of cases. The executive director may select and employ staff attorneys to perform the duties prescribed by this subsection. The appellate division shall maintain records of representation of eligible clients for record purposes only.

W. Va. Code §29-21-6(e).

The agency's fourth division, the Appointed Counsel Services Division, contains the voucher processing staff that processes for payment the vouchers which are submitted by private attorneys who accept appointments in eligible proceedings, which are defined as follows:

Criminal charges which may result in incarceration; juvenile proceedings; proceedings to revoke parole or probation if the revocation may result in incarceration; contempt of court; child abuse and neglect proceedings which may result in a termination of

parental rights; mental hygiene commitment proceedings; extradition proceedings; proceedings which are ancillary to an eligible proceeding, including, but not limited to, proceedings to enhance sentences brought pursuant to sections eighteen and nineteen, article eleven, chapter sixty-one of this code, forfeiture proceedings brought pursuant to article seven, chapter sixty-a of this code, and proceedings brought to obtain extraordinary remedies; and appeals from or post-conviction challenges to the final judgment in an eligible proceeding. Legal representation provided pursuant to the provisions of this article is limited to the court system of the state of West Virginia, but does not include representation in municipal courts unless the accused is at risk of incarceration

W. Va. Code §29-21-2(2). A “help desk” is also part of the division and is designed to assist attorneys with the preparation of vouchers.

The agency’s fifth division is the Public Defender Corporation Resource Center, which is dedicated to providing services to the administrators of, and attorneys within, the eighteen public defender corporations operating throughout the state. The Center is a recognition that not every public defender corporation can support or fund certain positions critical to the representation of a client. Also, the Center is a recognition that the corporations, while separate entities, must maintain uniform systems centralized within the agency in order to maximize the funding made available through legislative appropriation. Accordingly, the Center houses a criminal justice specialist, a juvenile resource specialist, an administrator, and a program assistant.

In addition to the agency’s divisions, the statutory framework for the agency includes two additional entities.

Indigent Defense Commission.

The first is the Indigent Defense Commission. Specifically,

- (a) There is hereby established the Indigent Defense Commission to provide assistance to Public Defender Services with regard to the general policies and procedures of the agency, including, but not limited to, the opening, closing or merging of public defender offices throughout the state and the establishment of performance measures for the qualitative review of indigent defense.
- (b) In order to demonstrate a collaborative approach to solving criminal justice problems, the commission shall consist of the Executive Director of Public Defender Services, who shall serve as chair, and the following members appointed by the Governor:

- (1) One former or retired circuit judge;
 - (2) Three lawyers, one from each congressional district, who have significant experience in the defense of criminal cases or have demonstrated a strong commitment to quality representation of indigent defendants;
 - (3) One current chief public defender; [...],
 - (4) One nonlawyer with a demonstrated commitment to providing legal services to the indigent;
 - (5) One person who is a member of an organization that advocates on behalf of people with mental illness and developmental disabilities; and
 - (6) One attorney with significant experience in the defense of juvenile delinquency and abuse and neglect cases.
- (c) The commission shall meet at the times and places specified by the call of the chair: Provided, That the commission shall meet no less than four times each year. Members shall serve without compensation but may receive reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses for each day or portion thereof engaged in this discharge of official duties in a manner consistent with the guidelines of the Travel Management Office of the Department of Administration.
- ...
- (f) The commission has the following powers and duties:
- (1) To develop standards regarding the qualifications and training for public defenders, assistant public defenders and staff;
 - (2) To explore opportunities related to the training of appointed panel attorneys;
 - (3) To evaluate, on an annual basis, the compensation and caseloads of public defenders and appointed panel attorneys;
 - (4) To develop standards for providing and compensating expert witnesses, investigators and other persons who provide services related to legal representation under this article;

- (5) To study, monitor and evaluate existing standards for determining eligibility for legal representation under section sixteen of this article;
- (6) To study the feasibility and need of creating additional public defender corporations, the activation of public defender corporations and the formation of multicircuit or regional public defender corporations in accordance with the provisions of section eight of this article;
- (7) To study the potential for the dissolution of public defender corporations;
- (8) To study, monitor, evaluate and make recommendations regarding the training, experience and background necessary for a public defender or panel attorney to competently represent indigent defendants in capital cases; and
- (9) To monitor and make recommendations regarding the following activities of the board of directors of each public defender corporation receiving funding pursuant to this article:
 - (A) The appointment of the public defender and any assistant public defenders pursuant to subdivision (1), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article;
 - (B) The fixing of professional and clerical salaries pursuant to subdivision (2), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article; and
 - (C) The removal of any public defender, assistant public defender or other employee for misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance pursuant to subdivision (3), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article.

W. Va. Code §29-21-3b.

Public Defender Corporations.

The second entity is the public defender corporation, which, if active within a judicial circuit, is “to provide legal representation ... in accordance with the provisions” of the governing statute. W. Va. Code §29-21-8(a)(2).

For each public defender corporation, a board of directors is appointed. The chairperson of the board is appointed by the governor. One to two members for each county in the judicial circuit are appointed by the county commission. One to two additional members are appointed by each county bar association within the judicial circuit. The board selects a “chief” public defender who is then responsible for the delivery of legal services by the corporation. Unless inconsistent with the governing statute, the provisions of the state’s nonprofit corporate laws govern the public defender corporations.

**AUDITING AND ACCOUNTING DIVISION:
 PUBLIC DEFENDER CORPORATIONS**

For FY 2019, there were eighteen public defender corporations serving nineteen judicial circuits (see subsequent table below). Although Public Defender Services establishes strategic objectives for the delivery of legal services to indigents in eligible proceedings, public defender corporations are not subordinate divisions of this agency. In essence, employees of the public defender corporations are neither employees of Public Defender Services nor employees of the State of West Virginia but are employees of a specific non-profit organization governed by a board of directors appointed by the Governor, local bar associations, and county commissions.

For FY 2019, Public Defender Services provided \$18,932,603.85 in funding to and on behalf of the Public Defender Corporations. In return, the Public Defender Corporations reported 259,816.10 attorney hours and 35,696 closed cases. This represents approximately \$73.06 per hour and \$531.79 per closed case. However, upon reducing the attorney time by the 66,765.10 hours reported as administrative time, the cost per hour increases to \$98.33² with no effect to the overall cost per case.

² This includes hours reported as drug court time (1,386.20), the cost per hour increases to \$99.04 when drug court time is removed.

PUBLIC DEFENDER CORPORATION RESOURCE CENTER

Public Defender Services (PDS) developed the Public Defender Corporation Resource Center (PDCRC) to serve public defender corporations across the state by utilizing specialists to assist attorneys in criminal defense advocacy. In addition to the resources and services available from the Appellate Advocacy Division, the following resources are available to attorneys and staff members of the Public Defender Corporations (PDCs): Mitigation and Alternative Sentencing Resources, Juvenile Resources, and Administrative, Personnel, & Technology Assistance and/or Consultation.

WHO WE ARE

Stephanne Thornton, our Criminal Justice specialist, is a licensed and clinically trained social worker and addictions counselor, as well as a Certified Clinical Trauma Professional and a Certified Sexual Offender Treatment Provider. She works with public defenders to help identify client issues, determine treatment options, create mitigation themes, recommend alternatives to incarceration, seek experts for assessment and testimony, interpret client treatment records, analyze relevant scientific research, and serve as a liaison to community programs serving the criminal offender population.

In addition to mitigation and sentencing advocacy, Stephanne explores external grant and private funding opportunities on behalf of public defender offices to fulfill their mission of zealous advocacy, particularly through sentencing advocacy.

Jessica Hudnall, our PDCRC Coordinator, reviews the PDC monthly financial reports, maintains the PDC employment roster records, and coordinates access to electronic resources, such as the case management system and the online legal research service. Jessica is the primary liaison between PDS and the PDCs, assists with the annual conference, and serves on the PDS Social Committee.

Jonathan Friley, the PDC Administrator, is responsible for the overall health of the PDC system by ensuring compliance with funding contract conditions. In addition to his fiscal duties, Jonathan utilizes his leadership background, strong technology skills, and law degree to assist the PDCs with policy/procedure development and review, board engagement, employee and management training/coaching, leadership development, creation of best practices, and other administrative and personnel related matters.

ACTIVITIES

Fiscal Year 2019 was an eventful year for the PDCRC. We continued our PDC tour, visiting seven offices. We met with the attorneys and support staff to learn about the local nuances unique to that specific office, including any challenges they face, and whether those stem from external practice issues or internal factors such as resources and location.

We are particularly proud we revived and reimagined the Core Staff (non-attorney) track to our annual conference. Led by the PDCRC and Sarah Saul from the Appellate Advocacy Division, nearly fifty Core Staff participated in multiple sessions covering leadership, resilience, and influence. Lida Shepherd facilitated *Client Experiences*, part of the Criminal Justice Listening

Project. In this session, several individuals who had previous contact with the system discussed their experiences, circumstances, and subsequent challenges, followed by a discussion with the Core Staff on what public defender offices can do to better serve clients and assist with reentry.

We also attended several local and national conferences. Stephanie attended the West Virginia Association of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors (WVAADC) conference and a meeting of the Morgantown Mental Well Being subcommittee, both held in Morgantown. She also attended the Court Improvement Program training in Charleston, and, through the Danya Institute, became a motivational interviewing trainer which she plans to apply to training legal practitioners in work with their clients in the future. Stephanie also had the privilege of presenting at the National Association for Public Defense (NAPD) “*We the Defenders!* Investigator, Social Worker, and Sentencing Advocate Conference” in Indianapolis and Biloxi, and presented at the National Association of Social Workers’ (WV Chapter) Spring Continuing Education Conference in Charleston.

Jonathan attended the AlignHR conference in Morgantown, as well as NAPD’s Executive Leadership Institute (ELI) in Frankfort, KY. ELI brings together approximately 150 other public defense leaders from around the country to tackle various issues we face and improve our leadership skills.

AVAILABLE RESOURCES & DIRECT ASSISTANCE

Indigent defense is an often-thankless profession that is filled with long hours and very limited resources. Although our funding structure limits the PDCRC’s direct assistance³ to Public Defender Corporations, we recognize the limitations practitioners face and make resources available to the greater-legal community whenever possible. **Many of the resources the agency creates to support zealous advocacy and holistic representation of indigent criminal defendants are available on our website or on our blog⁴.**

One hundred ninety-eight (198) attorneys attended these conferences. Attendees earned up to 10.8 credits of continuing legal education, including 2.4 hours of ethics/office management.

APPELLATE ADVOCACY DIVISION

“The right of an accused in a criminal trial to due process is in essence, the right to a fair opportunity to defend against the State’s accusations.” *Chambers v. Mississippi*, 410 U.S. 284, 294, 93 S. Ct. 1038, 1045 (1973). The Appellate Advocacy Division strives to protect this right and to ensure that West Virginia conducts its criminal trials in accordance with the rule of law rather than compromising justice in light of the citizen-defendants’ perceived opprobrium.

The Appellate Advocacy Division’s primary task is to pursue appeals on behalf of indigent criminal defendants throughout the state who stand convicted of serious crimes resulting in lengthy prison sentences. The Appellate Advocacy Division prefers complex cases or cases presenting issues of first impression so that in addition to protecting each individual client’s rights, the law in general can advance in a positive direction.

A noteworthy affirmation of a citizen’s right against unreasonable search and seizure in West Virginia resulted from a case Matthew Brummond presented before the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia. **The question the Court decided was whether a warrant issued to search a residence authorized officers to search “all persons” present, including, the petitioner who was only a guest.** Matthew argued the search of petitioner was an illegal warrantless search. He further asserted that the circuit court erred by denying trial counsel’s motion to suppress the evidence recovered from petitioner’s person.

The Supreme Court agreed with Matthew, reversing petitioner’s conviction. The Supreme Court held that mere presence in a home where drugs were discovered did not result in probable cause to search petitioner. The Court further held that a warrant to search a residence did not grant authority to search the petitioner who happened to be present at the time the warrant was served. *State v. Barefield*, 240 W.Va. 587, 814 S.E.2d 250 (2018).

The Appellate Advocacy Division believes that trial and appellate lawyers can develop a united front in the defense of the indigent citizens of our state. In an effort to implement this team approach, the division assists attorneys throughout the State by answering attorney assistance calls and participating in continuing legal education programs offered by the Criminal Law Research Center.

The Appellate Advocacy Division welcomes any practicing criminal defense lawyer within the state to call with legal questions they may have, regarding a court appointed case. The assigned appellate attorney will research any issue and provide prompt feedback. The Appellate Advocacy Division offers other services, as well. The attorneys will brainstorm issues in a case, review discovery and offer suggestions or host a moot court in person or via phone conference.

The Appellate Advocacy Division is dedicated to vigorous representation of every client during both the trial and the appellate phase. Our ultimate goal is to help ensure that every indigent citizen charged with a crime enjoys all the constitutional rights and protections guaranteed under the constitutions of both the United States and West Virginia.

INDIGENT DEFENSE COMMISSION

In calendar year 2019, the Indigent Defense Commission was comprised of the following members:

Dana F. Eddy, serving as the chair by virtue of his position as the Executive Director of Public Defender Services; **Honorable John L. Cummings**, Senior Status Judge from Milton; **Lonnie C. Simmons**, a criminal defense attorney for the 2nd Congressional District and Chair of the Public Defender Corporation for the 13th Judicial Circuit, from Charleston; **Teresa McCune**, a criminal defense attorney from the 3rd Congressional District and Chief Defender for the 30th Judicial Circuit, from Williamson; **Joshua Edwards**, Chief Public Defender for the 11th Judicial Circuit, from Lewisburg; **Lawrence P. Shao**, a non-attorney and former Professor of Finance at Marshall University, from Huntington; **Karen B. Yost**, President and Chief Executive Officer of Prestera Center for Mental Health Services, Inc., from Huntington; and **Jane Moran**, an attorney with significant experience in the defense of Juvenile delinquency and abuse and neglect cases, from Williamson. **Valena E. Beatty**, an attorney from Morgantown in the 1st Congressional District, and WVU College of Law Professor and Chair of the WV Innocence Project, served until April 3, 2019.

The Commission met on September 12, 2018. Stephanie Thornton, Criminal Justice Specialist for PDS, showed an NBC film clip of the Boone County Drug Court, including comments by Judge William Thompson. She discussed efforts to create a network of 6 Recovery Coaches who would work within the 18 existing Public Defender Corporations (PDCs) to provide services throughout the state. Mr. Eddy discussed legislation to establish a Habeas Division within PDS that he planned to submit to the Governor's office for approval. Crystal Walden, Director of the Appellate Advocacy Division and Director of the Criminal Law Research Center, discussed the partnership between PDS and West Virginia University (WVU) to create a certification program for panel attorneys. Don Stennett, General Counsel for PDS, discussed resources available on the PDS website, including Jury Instructions and Motions which can be downloaded into Microsoft word documents. Mr. Eddy gave an overview of the meeting of the West Virginia Advisory Committee of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights held at the Capitol on July 19, 2018. He and other staff members of PDS attended and participated on panels during the hearing, which was dedicated to Collateral Consequences of a Felony Records in WV – Access to Employment, Housing, Occupational Licenses, and Public Benefits.

The Commission met by conference call on January 9, 2019. Brenda Thompson, General Counsel, reported that a bill transferring initial voucher approval from judges to PDS, authorizing PDS to contract for noncriminal services such as mental hygiene or abuse and neglect, establishing record-keeping requirements for appointed counsel, and increasing the rates of compensation for panel attorneys had been considered by the legislature for the past four years, and would be considered in the upcoming legislative session, with support of the Senate Judiciary Committee and the Criminal Law Section of the Association for Justice. Mr. Eddy reported that he is seeking funding for recovery coaches in six Public Defender Corporations

(PDCs) across the state and discussed the justification for the funding. He reported that the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC) continues to pursue attorneys who overbill the state. PDS staff continue to devote significant amount of time to respond to requests and subpoenas.

The Commission met again on April 23, 2019. At that meeting, Chief Defenders from the Public Defender Corporations (PDCs) or their proxies reported on their costs per case and the challenges they face in their jurisdictions. Ms. Thompson discussed legislation enacted during the 2019 legislative session related to criminal law and the treatment of criminal defendants at various points of contact with the criminal justice system.







Of significant note over the last year, is the retirement of Bill Brogan. Mr. Brogan served over 29 years with the First Judicial Circuit. A true believer in protecting the rights of the indigent, Mr. Brogan spent a lifetime engaged in courtroom battles against the injustice and oppression inherent in State action. Mr. Brogan's temperament, gentle spirit, and sense of justice stand as testament to all our profession holds dear. An incomparable wealth of legal knowledge and experience, Mr. Brogan served as both a mentor and a friend. While Mr. Brogan's position will be replaced, he remains irreplaceable. By the Numbers

In FY 18, our Corporation handled nearly 60% of felony offenses involving indigent persons in the First Judicial Circuit. In addition to other actions such as parole revocations and miscellaneous matters, we represented nearly 87% of misdemeanors and 70% of juvenile cases requiring appointed counsel, resulting in a cost per case \$522.80 lower than panel attorneys. These raw numbers provide the best evidence of our cost effectiveness.¹

Public Defender Corporation for the Second Judicial Circuit

Once again, the Public Defender Corporation for the Second Judicial Circuit handled a significant amount of cases during the past fiscal year while returning a significant surplus to the people of West Virginia. During Fiscal Year 2019, the caseload was covered despite being short an Assistant Public Defender during the majority of the fiscal year due to an attorney being on military leave. However, the efforts of all staff and attorneys meant that the Corporation did not have to request a temporary halt to new appointments, a major accomplishment considering that the Corporation's office for the three-county-circuit is in the northernmost county of the circuit.

During the past fiscal year, 2 new staff and 2 new attorneys joined the Corporation. Tanya Yoho began work on July 2, 2018, and Kathleen Johnson began work on January 2, 2019—both of them do excellent work. Assistant Public Defender Jamie Crestfield began work as a temporary Assistant Public Defender on October 15, 2018, despite not having a permanent position being guaranteed and after declining the

employment offer of a prominent local civil litigation firm. She fortunately was able to stay with us permanently, after an Assistant Public Defender left to work as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney in a neighboring county, and she successfully argued a motion for a new trial—that felony case was eventually dismissed. That case was tried by Assistant Public Defender John Gainer, who was able to achieve a not guilty verdict for 1 count. He was also able to obtain a not guilty verdict on 1 of 2 charges in a Tyler County Circuit Court trial. The Corporation also had Ms. Crestfield's law school classmate Jared Lowe move from Beckley and join as an Assistant Public Defender on July 1, 2019.

Executive Director Dana Eddy has consistently and wisely called for Public Defender Corporations to be proactive in attacking the substance use epidemic and collaborating with community resources and the Courts. In early May 2019, the Corporation had the

opportunity to do that, when the Circuit’s presiding Drug Court Judge, David Hummel, asked permission to temporarily house the Drug Court probation officers at the Corporation’s office due to a reorganization of the Circuit’s Drug Court Program. Chief Public Defender Brett Ferro granted the request and secured the approval of the Corporation’s Board of Directors. Mr. Ferro also appeared with Judge Hummel when the Drug Court reorganization was on the agenda at the Marshall County Commission, and later was interviewed by the local news media. In that interview, Mr. Ferro noted that the annual funding provided by the County Commission of each county in the circuit was about the same as the annual cost to incarcerate one inmate in the Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

Public Defender Corporation for the Fourth Judicial Circuit

PDC4 is literally being buried in piles of files. These piles grow every day and are higher than ever. So many more files than in years past, that I had to undertake a small bit of research. For instance, in 1996 (the last year I was on Team Prosecutor), there were 163 felony cases filed in Wood County Circuit Court. By contrast, twenty-three years later, 299 felony cases have been filed as of October 6, 2019 with three months (and undoubtedly one special session of the grand jury) left to go. In 2018, 485 cases were bound over to the grand jury compared to 218 in 1996. The caseload has also modestly increased from our first year of operation (2016) when a total of 285 felony cases were filed in Wood County Circuit Court and 467 felony cases were bound over from magistrate court. Hard to believe what a drastic increase in criminal filings (and criminal activity?) there has been in twenty-three years.

Each client at PDC4 has a file. There are red files for misdemeanors, blue and purple files for felonies, green for juveniles, orange for parole violations and now yellow files for abuse and neglect cases. While managing the cases is a lot of work in and of itself, managing those piles of files is a never-ending headache. The files must be opened, scanned, entered into a database, distributed and put into cabinets, pulled for court, and then closed and purged, only to start all over again –with no end to the cycle. It’s so easy to become engrossed in the mechanics of creating and processing all of the paperwork. It’s tempting to fixate on the process of moving all these cases through the pipeline. And it’s also way too easy to forget the most important part of what each file represents: a person with problems that have been exposed by the pending charges – problems that seem to get more serious every year.

These people, also known as our clients have case numbers and client numbers. They also have names, addresses (or maybe not), birthdays, personalities, perhaps children or grandchildren or other family, maybe mental health diagnoses, perhaps physical disabilities or illnesses and on and on. They come in all shapes and sizes, from all parts of Wood, Wirt and other counties, and from states other than West Virginia. They have differing levels of education; differing abilities to grasp and process what is happening to them, differing sets of problems engulfing them and differing degrees of interest in what happens to them or their case. Some clients make such an impact that their names and the details that brought them here can be recalled for weeks, and months and even years thereafter. Others barely register, showing up only when absolutely necessary to deal with their case. Some never appear at all and remain just names on the folders.

After practicing law for ten, twenty, and even thirty-plus years, it is hardly surprising that it becomes easier and easier to think of cases as “files” and to forget that a person’s life is involved in that file. In fact, the legal system very much encourages and often forces those involved

including (and maybe especially) Public Defenders to regard cases that way. Otherwise, how would a Public Defender manage to make it through the day, not to mention surviving the weeks or months of one's career, worrying about every client and every person and the consequences of the problems he or she is facing.

Yet despite this and other challenges which fill-up a Public Defender's day, we continue to do it. We show up every day to do battle, knowing full well that many will be lost and only a few skirmishes will be won. That's why it's so heartening to see young Assistant Public Defender Hannah West make phone call after phone call to ensure that a client who has absconded from treatment is safe. That's why I'm proud and happy when I see attorney Nancy McGhee literally help an elderly grandmother walk to the clerk's office to post bond for her granddaughter. That's why I'm gratified to witness Andrew Hilber's infinite patience with a client who can't hear or speak. And to know that Legal Assistant Becky Sinnett is eager to attend seminars about substance use disorders or reentry. Not to mention success stories like Kiela Dye's, who has not only been successful in long-term recovery, but is now working at PDC4 with Dominique Kirl and helping others beat their problems with substance use disorder. And last but not least, let us not forget the part our kitties do in snuggling up to clients in the waiting room and putting them at ease.

So, piles of files be damned! Yes, the files will continue to be opened, to be scanned, to be closed, and so on, and the piles will continue to grow in size. But there will continue to be people whose situations are improved by virtue of the fact that their files landed in the PDC4 office. For that we can stop and feel better – if only for one tiny moment.

Public Defender Corporation for the Fifth Judicial Circuit

Organization's History:

The Public Defender Corporation held its first board meeting on the 31st day of July 1996 and includes the 5th Judicial Circuit of Calhoun, Roane, Jackson, and Mason counties in West Virginia. However, during the process the Mason County Bar brought a lawsuit against the corporation and was granted an injunction for operation in Mason County. At the time, the injunction was not challenged and the corporation along with Public Defender Services made the mutual decision not to litigate the injunction as Public Defender Services and the corporation being in their infancies and it was agreed it was more important to firmly establish the corporation and Public Defender Services generally. To this day the injunction has not been challenged.

Organizational Goals and Objectives:

Our goal is to provide high quality legal assistance to indigent persons who would be otherwise unable to afford adequate legal counsel; to provide legal representation to those who face an economic barrier to adequate legal counsel that will serve the ends of justice in accordance with rights and privileges guaranteed to all citizens by the constitution of the United States of America and the constitution of the state of West Virginia; to make available quality legal assistance that reaffirms the faith of our citizens in our government of laws.

The objective is to protect the ordinary citizen from wrongful conviction and to protect the basic and fundamental rights of all citizens by navigating those individuals charged with crimes through an evolving and complex legal system. A conviction based on sound law and tested facts with competent counsel is rarely overturned by the courts whereby society as a whole is protected by protecting individual rights.

Programs and Services:

Pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-8(a)(2) the purpose of a public defender corporation is to provide legal representation in the respective circuits in accordance with the provisions of that article. To that end, we provide appointed counsel in felony, misdemeanor, abuse and neglect, juvenile delinquency, juvenile status offenses, family court contempt when jail is contemplated, and mental hygiene proceedings.

Organizational Structure (board, staff, volunteers):

The Board of Directors is organized pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-15 consisting of a chairperson appointed by the Governor, two members from each county in which the corporation operates for a total of seven members. (A lawyer and non-lawyer each from Jackson, Roane, and Calhoun counties with a chairperson from Roane County.)

The board oversees the corporation pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-15. The chief public defender reports to the board of directors, each of the assistant public defenders and staff members report to the chief public defender. The chief public defender is ethically responsible for the conduct of the

assistant public defenders and the staff pursuant to Rules 5.1 and 5.3 of the West Virginia Rules of Professional Conduct (2013) for lawyers.

There are currently three office staff members which includes the office manager. In addition, there are seven lawyers which includes the chief public defender.

Current Employees:

Susan Slaven—Office Manager

Office Manager Susan Slaven has been employed for 22 years with the Public Defender Corporation 5th Judicial Circuit originally hired by well-known attorney and founding Chairman of our Board, Bert Goodwin. She has 34 years of experience in the legal system as a former employee of the Jackson County Sheriff's Department Law Enforcement Division, Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney's office, and Goodwin & Goodwin Law Firm.

Susan is a dedicated employee and public servant. Under her direction, the office has expanded from five total employees to twelve employees, along with two office expansions.

Ryanne Ball—Assistant Public Defender

Ryanne Ball is a 2014 graduate of the West Virginia University College of Law. Prior to attending law school, Ryanne received a bachelors degree in Political Science, also from WVU. Ryanne was a four-year member of The Pride of West Virginia, Mountaineer Marching band during her undergraduate years at WVU.

Upon graduating from law school and successfully passing the July 2014 bar examination, Ryanne began a one-year clerkship for the Honorable John W. Hatcher in Fayette County, West Virginia, before joining our office in December 2015. During her time with the PDC, Ryanne has worked on cases ranging from child abuse and neglect proceedings to serious felony offenses.

Rich also worked for a faculty member at the College of Law in helping to represent the rights of disabled students in IDEA and ADA cases. He began his post-law school career with a two-year judicial clerkship in the 30th Judicial Circuit of West Virginia. After his clerkship ended Rich continued in public service as an assistant public defender in the 6th Judicial Circuit, as an assistant attorney general assigned to employment programs litigation and workers' compensation in the office of the West Virginia Attorney General, and then as a litigation attorney for the West Virginia Department of Transportation, primarily handling right-of-way, condemnation, and contract cases. Rich left public service to enter the private practice of law on his own in Fairmont, doing court appointments, lemon law, contract law, tort law, before joining the private firm of Booth & McCarthy in Bridgeport for almost nine years. Rich has also represented union workers in grievances and before the Supreme Court of Appeals for the AFL-CIO, AFSCME, and WVSSPA. As Rich enters the third decade of his legal career, he has come full circle back to Public Defender Services, moving to Spencer last year. Small town life is quickly growing on him as he enjoys raising his pre-teen daughter and representing the rights of West Virginians in need.

Daniel Minardi—Assistant Public Defender

Daniel joined our Spencer office in August 2017 to be the office's primary attorney for Calhoun County. He is originally from Ritchie County, West Virginia, and attended WVU getting his bachelor's degree in mathematics and his master's degree in mathematics. Daniel spent two years teaching mathematics at Ritchie County High School.

He received his law degree from the West Virginia University College of Law in May of 2014 and was admitted to the West Virginia Bar that October. Afterward, he primarily prepared title opinions

for oil and gas production companies. Since joining the Public Defender's office, he has gained substantial magistrate court and circuit court experience. Daniel has obtained one acquittal out of three trials in magistrate court, and one hung jury (with a motion for judgment of acquittal granted on 15 counts of the 24-count indictment) in three felony trials in Circuit Court.

When not in the office, Daniel enjoys shooting sports and spending time with his family.

Andrew Vodden—Deputy Chief Public Defender

Andrew Vodden is the Deputy Chief Public Defender for the 5th Judicial Circuit of West Virginia, where he was worked for over three years. He is a 2004 graduate of the University of California, Santa Barbara with a Bachelors in English, and he graduated from law school at West Virginia University in 2014, where he simultaneously received a master's in public administration. A native Californian, Andrew moved to his adopted home state in 2011.

Andrew works out of the Spencer, West Virginia office where he handles felony cases, including serving as lead counsel for more than 10 felony jury trials during his short tenure, winning a number of acquittals on felony charges. He has begun to develop an expertise in DNA and its use in criminal proceedings. He attended the 2018 Wisconsin Trial Academy, where he learned the latest in trial techniques from experts around the country. A resident of Charleston, Andrew is recently married, and has a 13-year-old daughter.

New & Noteworthy for 2019

The corporation has had a few departures and additions. We had one lawyer leave our Jackson County office.

We continue to work diligently to protect each client's rights as they navigate the criminal legal system, often steering them toward sobriety. We have had several clients participate in the Drug Court Program. These folks have made and continue to make remarkable strides from addiction to sobriety. We have had graduates who have truly changed from a substance use disordered life to a life of sobriety and now hold full time jobs and maintain close family relationships that had been previously abandoned.

We initially received funding for a Peer recovery coach position through the Sisters Health Foundation. The peer recovery coach helps clients find available substance use rehabilitation facilities and keeps up with clients in treatment on a regular basis. We are excited to have more permanent funding for the Recovery Coach Position with the assistance of the legislature appropriating the necessary funds. We have seen an amount of success with the position that is beyond what we had hoped to accomplish getting clients sober and having them remain sober for an extended period. Recovery Coaches working with drug court and family treatment court have begun to fundamentally change the way in which clients are served in a positive and cost-effective way for long-term success.

Public Defender Corporation for the Sixth & Twenty-fourth Judicial Circuits

The Public Defender Corporation for the 6th and 24th Judicial Circuits was founded on July 1, 1994. Our felony case load continues to be high due to the number of drug and drug related cases. In an effort to relieve some of the pressure associated with helping our clients with substance use disorders get into a recovery program, a Recovery Coach has now been hired. Numerous programs and facilities have opened in the City of Huntington and the surrounding area to combat and overcome the overwhelming substance use epidemic and crisis.

In FY 2018, the Huntington office closed 3,365 cases, 1,029 of which were felonies, and the Wayne office closed 1,047 cases, 424 of which were felonies, for a grand total of 4,414 closed cases. There are currently 11 attorneys in the Huntington office and 5 support staff. There are 3 attorneys in the Wayne office and one support staff. Our offices continue to be active in helping establish and maintain Adult Drug Courts and Day Report Centers in both counties, as well as participate in the Juvenile Drug Court in both counties.

FY 2018 saw the retirement of Vickii Hughes as Office Manager, a position she held for 24 years. The Public Defender Corporation for the 6th and 24th Circuits continues to strive to provide quality representation for our clients in our region regardless of our large caseload. Historically, our office continues to be one of the leading Public Defender offices in cost effective representation.

Several members of our staff also serve our community beyond our office. Brent Walters serves on the Board of Directors for the Western Regional Day Report Center, and Bridget Lucas is a voluntary nursery coordinator for the Christ Temple Church.

Public Defender Corporation for the Seventh Judicial Circuit²

The Public Defender's Office for the Seventh Judicial Circuit-Logan County was very active this past fiscal year protecting the Constitutional Rights of their Clients and trying to save the lives of their many clients with substance use disorders. We believe we were very effective in achieving alternative sentences that used both outpatient and inpatient treatment to help clients. Further, we were very effective in getting cases dismissed or reduced that were not accurately charged and for various factual, Constitutional and technical reasons. My staff worked extremely hard to get our statistics in proper order. As reflected in our Time Matters Data, we opened 867 cases and closed 1504 cases. While those numbers give an idea of the day-to-day operations and how many cases we are routinely dealing with, they do not tell the entire story and I hope the information below is helpful in further illustrating the role we play in the Logan County Criminal Justice System and in the Logan County Community.

THE LOGAN COUNTY TEAM

The Chief, Dwayne Adkins. I am a Wayne County Adkins, but I have been a Logan County resident since 1995 when I was hired as an assistant public defender by John Bennett. Since marrying my wife, a social worker and Logan County native, I have considered Logan my permanent home. I left the Public Defender fold for several years and was a plaintiff's lawyer, insurance defense lawyer and an assistant prosecutor. I brought those skills gained outside the Public Defender System back with me when I took over as Chief to help Public Defender clients and the Logan County Community. I have been the Chief Public Defender since 2005 and have increased

my community activities and involvement every year since taking over as Chief because our Office and our staff are crucial parts of the community with a shared goal of making our community a better place to live.

Assistant Public Defender, Gerald Merceruio. Gerald has been with our Office since soon after its creation in 1991. He does a good job of protecting the Constitutional Rights of his clients and has a reputation for being difficult to deal with which is actually very beneficial to the clients. Secretaries must be gatekeepers and Crystal is incredibly good at prioritizing and filtering the many issues that arise each day. She has also proved to be a very good Office Sargent who appropriately and with my blessing gets aggressive with lawyers if they are running late for Court, closing in on a deadline, or just need a kick in the tail to get rolling.

Temporary Intern, Robert Evans. Robert came to us from Appalachian School Law in Grundy, VA. Robert was on board for legal research and general assistance while studying for the Bar and preparing for his jump to the Appellate Division with Public Defender Services. He was a great asset to getting the most up to date legal analyses on many issues facing our clients. He is missed,

but we truly expect great things out of him at Public Defender Services that benefits all public defender clients.

ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE FISCAL YEAR

This fiscal year saw some new type of achievements and some consistently recurring achievements. An example of a new achievements is that a new young male client graduated the *Fresh Start* and moved forward with new skills, a job, the ability to support his very young son, and **no record**. The *Fresh Start* program has great potential and we were pleased our client was the very first graduate in Logan County. We believe this is a pattern that can be repeated and we have several in the same pipe-line to success.

Examples of recurring successful achievements are reflected in the many clients that have attended and successfully completed inpatient substance use treatment programs ranging from 28-day programs at Anchor Point in Delbarton to programs that last over one year throughout the State. Successful graduates were rewarded with alternative sentences and credit off their sentence for the time spend successfully in rehab.

We're proud of the significant role we continue to play in preventing unnecessary and long periods of incarceration. Our greatest accomplishment is that we play a crucial role in helping clients achieve success beyond the courthouse.

The statistics mentioned in the beginning of this narrative do not fully illustrate our success and involvement in the community. For example, the number of felony cases opened and the number of cases that remain felonies are very different. Many cases are dismissed or reduced, and we play a very direct and consistent role in that process. Our clients' rights are protected, and we also save the County and State money.

CONSISTENT COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For many years now office members have contributed to the Logan County community by assisting with youth programs, being active Church members, and helping neglected animals.

I am on the Southwestern Regional Day Report Board. The Southwestern Regional Day Report serves Logan, Mingo, Boone, and Lincoln Counties and has proven to save lives and money by offering rehabilitative services. I am also a member of the Drug Court Team for Logan County, which takes the most extreme addiction cases and turns lives around. I am the Chair of Logan County Library Board because literacy and promoting a love of books in the community is important to fighting the epidemics of drug addiction and poverty. I am also a Timer and sometimes Referee for the local swim team. Organized sports are crucial to keeping kids from ever becoming clients and we are blessed to have the fantastic Chief Logan Rec Center that is constantly trying to improve their programs.

Pam continues to work with the Paws Squad, Logan County's excellent Animal Rescue Team. She provides foster care for the animals and participates in many fundraising endeavors both in and out of Logan County. It is utterly amazing the number of dogs and cats that group has saved.

Don is an active member of his church and he and his wife help with the small Christian school that his son attends. His son is also a member of the swim team where Don helps with fund raising and events.

Carol is an active member of her community and church. She plays an important role in the lives of her children and grandchildren, while playing a big role in the recovery community as outlined above.

Ashley is our representative on the Juvenile Drug Court Team. Outside of the office, she develops programs designed to help special needs children. As a mother of an autistic son, she is uniquely focused on knowledge of programs designed to help special needs children—this knowledge benefits clients and the community as whole.

AN IMPORTANT AND GROWING TEAM

We would like to end the narrative this year by stating that we are trying to adapt to the changing needs of our indigent clients. The meth, fentanyl, and heroin epidemic has had a shocking impact on our community and changed the needs of our clients. We are happy to report that Public Defender Services has provided us with our first shared Recovery Coach, Tyson Compton. He is already making a positive impact for our clients and the community, and we expect to be able to give a great report next fiscal year.

A CLOSING NOTE

The practice of law as criminal defense attorney and the role of public defender offices has changed significantly in the last decade as it is extremely hard to represent clients who are so impacted and affected by addiction. Our response has been to work to help them get the treatment they need whether before their case is resolved or after depending on many issues and circumstances that differ from case to case. I think we are doing extremely well given the limited resources. However, in the early morning hours around two or three a.m. when I am called out for a mental hygiene hearing, I am reminded that many of these people could be helped before they ever enter the criminal justice system or at least as repeat offenders. Society is still reluctant to call addiction what it is: a mental illness. Despite causing a person to lose their ability to control their behavior or correctly, perceive reality, it is still not treated and cared for like the illness it is. An honest review of the mental hygiene statutes and system will reveal that it is far from adequate in its current form and does little to aid in helping people recovery from substance use disorder. Very short treatment periods are used and having serious drugs in your system such as meth does not result in long term inpatient treatment and often results in no treatment if you do not have dual diagnosis of addiction and a properly categorized mental illness. It could be so much more effective

if revamped. The change in the written law would be easy, but it would take a lot of resources to create meaningful change. Within a few years we would see a drastic reduction in the recidivist and incarceration rates which would offset the initial costs of setting up appropriate long-term inpatient treatment facilities and hiring staff for them. (Incidentally, the number of mental hygiene petitions filed have drastically dropped over the last few years.) That is not a good thing given the overwhelming substance use epidemic and number of people living with a substance use disorder. It reflects the fact that the families of Logan County have become very aware that these petitions do not help with addiction cases because such proceedings are not designed to provide true help for addiction cases.

Public Defender Corporation for the Eighth Judicial Circuit

The 8th Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation opened in 1990 and is now in its 29th year of operation. The office currently has a staff of three attorneys, one secretary and an office manager. The office relocated to a newly renovated space on the ground floor of a local building about a year and a half ago.

Chief Public Defender, Floyd A. Anderson, is a native of McDowell County. He earned his degree in Psychology from WVU in 1999, and his law degree from Southern University Law Center in 1992. He became a member of the WV State Bar in 1994. Mr. Anderson joined the office in 1995 and became Chief in 1998. He has tried a number of complex cases involving first degree murder, robbery, and sexual assault. He also remains active in the local community.

Robert E. Blair, better known as “Pete”, is a native of McDowell County and joined the office in 2003. He maintained a private practice for years and served as a Family Law Master. He has been a member of the WV State Bar since 1956, now 62 years. Pete reached his 91st birthday in January this year.

Marcia L. Hebb is a native of West Virginia who has made McDowell County her home now for fifteen years. Ms. Hebb joined this office in June of this year after almost 15 years of driving to work at the Raleigh County Public Defender Office. She also worked at the Pocahontas County office for almost two years. She served in the US Army after high school and graduated from law school in Michigan in 1996.

Kimberly Cox, currently in her 25th year with the office, joined as secretary in 1994. She has now been the office manager since 1997. Kim manages the attendance/leave records, funding, bills/invoices, and payroll, and performs a myriad of secretarial duties. She has been one of the major assets in this office’s success.

Our office currently has an open position for a secretary due to the retirement of Robin Oakley and the unfortunate passing of Jennifer Adkins. Jennifer replaced Robin for a short few months before passing suddenly at the young age of 47.

McDowell County has an extensive need for legal representation for the indigent due to a devastated economy and the opioid crisis. Located in the most southern part of the state, McDowell has suffered extensive losses, economically and socially. The county seat, Welch, was once known as the “little New York City” until the significant cuts in the coal industry. The current substance use epidemic has been associated with lost jobs and revenue such that the county has cut employee salaries upwards of ten percent, including law enforcement. The county has lost two major employers, Walmart and Magic Mart.

The struggle for solutions has led to extensive work by this office through alternative sentencing, the local drug court, and our new peer recovery coach. Substance use disorder issues seem to affect every area of representation. Our office provides representation in felonies, misdemeanors, delinquency/truancy, guardianship/conservatorships, extraditions, mental hygiene, and abuse and

neglect proceedings. We also are active in drug court and community corrections (day report). The office maintains a substantial abuse and neglect caseload, representing at least one respondent or child in almost every case.

The local bar representation has now been reduced such that there are only two active private attorneys. In order to fulfill the remaining need for representation, several attorneys travel from other counties to handle conflict cases and some mental hygiene petitions. Our most recent loss occurred with the death of Phillip LaCaria.

The office has many hills to climb but continues to work diligently to defend the indigent population of this resilient county.

Public Defender Corporation for the Ninth Judicial Circuit

The office was established in June 1991. Our office currently has six attorneys with one vacancy, and six support staff positions. During the past year, we welcomed attorneys Stephanie Pfeifer and Caitlan Flanagan-Morgan, and a new support staff member, Jessica Jones.

Mercer County, West Virginia has three Circuit Judges, five Magistrates, and two Criminal Municipal Courts in which we appear. We also serve on the Southern Regional Community Justice Board with other community representatives.

Our office has members on the Adult Drug Court and Juvenile Drug Court. Approximately **fifty** individuals have graduated from Adult Drug Court in the last five years. Substance use disorder problems continue to be pervasive in Mercer County. Jaime Arnold continues to coordinate placement for our clients in substance use treatment facilities. Mercer County has one of the highest abuse and neglect caseloads in the state due, in part, to the substance use epidemic.

The office successfully uses alternative sentencing options such as deferred adjudications and inpatient substance use treatments. We continue to obtain hundreds of dismissals.

The office won an appeal in an abuse and neglect case.

As we've done in the past, we once again hosted numerous judges from Mongolia who were visiting via the Open World's Rule of Law Program. We have various attorneys who are actively involved in service organizations and their respective churches. Gerald Linkous began teaching a mass

communication law class at Concord University. John Byrd shares his artistic expertise by giving piano lessons.

Our Office is honored to represent the indigent in Mercer County and are dedicated to protect their constitutional rights

We have recently welcomed Rebecca Powers and Sheila Beggs to our support staff. Our office

obtained hundreds of dismissals and also secured acquittals in various trials this past year. Our attorneys continue to utilize deferred adjudications and substance use treatment for our clients. Jaime Arnold oversees placement for our clients in substance use treatment facilities.

We serve on the Southern Regional Community Criminal Justice Board which monitors the operations at the Day Report Center. The office also serves on the Adult Drug Court and Juvenile Drug Court, which involves intensive treatment and extensive court monitoring. Substantial substance use disorder problems permeate a large percentage of our cases. The courts in Mercer County have tried to be proactive in dealing with the substance use epidemic by utilizing these alternatives, including a recently opened new substance use treatment facility exclusively for women.

Attorney, Taylor D. Potts, continues to serve the community as a foster parent and actively working with youth at his church.

Public Defender Corporation for the Tenth Judicial Circuit

The State of West Virginia has given State employees 5% raises, but Public Defender Corporation employees weren't included in these raises. Yet, we continue to maintain a high level of competence in our cases, despite little recognition of our impact in decreasing the cost to the state, counties, and municipalities.

In January 2019 Joseph A. Noggy retired and Wilbert A. Payne became the Chief Public Defender. Since then, there have been many changes: Marcia L. Hebb has moved on to McDowell County Eighth Judicial Circuit; James McClain has moved on to Mercer County with an adoption office; Patrick Brooks and Josh Thompson are now employed with the Raleigh County Prosecuting Attorney Office; Tom Moore has retired.

This office still has very experienced attorneys beginning with 38 years for Wilburt A. Payne, Kris N. Kostenko with 22 years, Stacey Fragile, Assistant Chief Public Defender, with 19 years, Robert D. Goldberg with 20 years and Sarah Smith with 10 years. We have a new Attorney, Ryan Jackson, who passed the bar in 2019 and started with this office in October.

Although this office is short three attorneys, we are managing to meet all the demands we are confronted with from day to day. We have recently contracted out our parole and mental hygiene cases to Michael Froble, a local attorney, which has allowed our overworked attorneys to concentrate on the other pending files that they are assigned.

Last year this office closed a total of 2,724 cases which is 98 more cases from the year before. The cases consisted of 626 felonies, 1,338 misdemeanors, 174 mental hygiene, 153 juvenile, 302 parole and probation revocations, 13 abuse and neglects, 1 habeas, and 117 other cases. Each attorney handled on the average of 302 cases last year. Although this is in excess of the recommended amount by the American Bar Association, this office handles all cases without any major issues.

In FY2018 our office handled almost 72% of all cases in Raleigh County while receiving only 54% of the funds distributed by Public Defender Services to the Tenth Circuit.

Office Staff

Our office staff is the key to our success in which we currently have four legal assistants, one full time receptionist, and a part time case manager. The office has two office managers, Melanie Ellison for personnel matters and Susan Delp for administrative matters. The assistants who aide them are Sharon Owens and Donnita Marks. Nichola Campbell is the full-time receptionist and Alice McClure is the part time case manager. Our peer recovery coach, Theresa Jordan, has worked on a total of 103 cases since July of 2019, while also serving clients for the public defender offices in Fayette, Greenbrier, and Pocahontas counties.

Public Defender Corporation for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit

Our office opened in 1999 with the goal of providing high quality and cost-effective criminal defense to the citizens of Greenbrier and Pocahontas Counties. While the foundations of practice (caring about your clients, investigating your cases, and being prepared for court) have not changed since 1999, the rest of the criminal defense practice has changed dramatically.

West Virginia's place at the center of the opioid crisis has left everyone in the criminal legal system struggling for solutions and the 11th Judicial Circuit has been a leader in innovating and adopting new solutions. Chief Defender Joshua Edwards and Deputy Chief Defender Dewitt Daniell both serve on the advisory committee for Greenbrier County's Day Report Program. Joshua Edwards and Laura Spadaro both serve as members of the drug court treatment team in Pocahontas County and Dewitt Daniell serves as a member of the treatment team in Greenbrier County. In addition to their formal role, Public Defenders serve as informal advisers on policy matters and legal questions as they arise.

Joshua Edwards is the Chief Defender for Greenbrier and Pocahontas Counties that together make up the 11th Judicial Circuit. Mr. Edwards was appointed to the Indigent Defense Commission by Governor Justice in April of 2017. This year Mr. Edwards was selected to attend the National Judicial Leadership Summit IV on Child Welfare.

He and the assistant defenders in the 11th Judicial Circuit continue to implement treatment-based programs as alternatives to the warehousing that occurs with incarceration. He states that "I'm proud of the efforts we've made with the Public Defender Corporation, Drug Court, and Day Report Programs to combat the addition epidemic and restore individuals to their community. I'm particularly excited that this year we've added a Peer recovery coach to the PDC".

In addition to his duties as Chief Public Defender, Mr. Edwards serves on the Community Corrections Advisory Board in both Greenbrier and Pocahontas Counties. He also serves on the Pocahontas County Drug Court treatment team and is a frequent contributor to both formal and informal efforts to improve the criminal justice system. Mr. Edwards enjoys the challenges of the courtroom and getting to know his clients as human beings so that he can tell their story and help

them write a better conclusion. He indicates, “As my children have gotten older and more involved in community events I realize the impact my work has on children and the community as a whole. Every time I go to a parent night at the school I see parents with their children who would not be able to be there without the Public Defender Corporation. It is particularly rewarding when you know that you were able to arrange for the parent to complete drug court or rehab and you know that they’re not only with their child, but able to be a great parent to that child.”

Each person is different, with a different problem to solve, and with a different background. Sadly, our area is plagued by massive unemployment, leading to problems with DUI, domestic abuse, and rampant abuse of opioids and methamphetamines. It is often heart-rending to come to work and view some of the ravages my clients have undergone.

On the human side, I’ve scaled back some of my community involvement. I no longer volunteer at the animal shelter, though I recently adopted ‘Dusty’, a handsome grey cat who has been there, apparently, longer than any other feline in their history. He proudly wrestles with my two other furballs when I walk in the door at five o’clock. Our cases often read like tragic novels, and I am working, in my spare time, on a book of stories. A friend of Mom’s family, back in Richland Center, wrote a series of stories titled ‘Sauk Prairie People’ and I hope to emulate him.

Steve reports that, since last year, “I have been working in magistrate and municipal court, and preparing for retirement. It still feels odd to get a phone call from Medicare. Yet it is truly enjoyable to work in an office where everybody is finally younger than I am”.

JUDGE JOHN W. HATCHER, JR. RETIRES THE ABUSE AND NEGLECT CRISIS

This fiscal year marked changes in the practice of law in Fayette County. The biggest change is the retirement of Judge Hatcher. Judge Hatcher was always a strong advocate for our Public Defender Office. Judge Hatcher was in the Legislature when the Public Defender system was created. He often would tell me that he had insisted on having Fayette County specifically added to the initial counties to have a Public Defender Office. He was always available to offer advice and guidance to our office, and he was always careful to create a record of the work we put into our cases.

Balance was maintained at the time of Judge Hatcher's retirement however, because we still had Judge Paul M. Blake. Judge Blake is also a strong advocate of our office. Prior to taking on his role as Fayette County Prosecuting Attorney, and then Circuit Judge, Judge Blake served as a member of the board of directors for our office. Given that he served in the early years of this office we do credit him for helping to create the strong foundation on which the office still relies.

Judge Hatcher was replaced by Judge Thomas H. Ewing. Prior to taking on his new challenge, Judge Ewing was a member of our board of directors and had attended the annual public defender conference. Judge Ewing did appointment work especially in abuse and neglect cases. This layer of his diverse experience made the transition easier for our office in that we knew he understood the workings of the public defender system. It has been clear during his time on the bench that he is also supportive of our office.

I credit in large part the stress of handling abuse and neglect cases to the timing of Judge Hatcher's retirement. For those not familiar with this type of action, abuse and neglect cases start when the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources files a Petition seeking legal and physical custody of children because it is suspected they are being abused and/or neglected. The lion's share of these cases relates to substance use addiction. The outcome of these cases can be heart wrenching in that if the parents are unable to correct the problems, it leads to a petition that their parental rights to their children be terminated.

The volume of these cases has exploded throughout West Virginia over the past several weeks. This is also true in Fayette County. To be clear—this office *does* provide representation in abuse and neglect proceedings. It is not unusual for there to be numerous hearings and or multi-disciplinary team (MDT) meetings every day. More than five years ago the decision was made in our office to have a single attorney handle all the abuse and neglect cases to which we are appointed. This was to allow the other staff attorneys to be able to prepare for adult felony work which requires significant preparation time.

Jennifer Alvarez was our abuse and neglect attorney for about five years. However, she will be

leaving our office soon to clerk for Judge Kirkpatrick in Raleigh County.

There is no clear answer to how to resolve the emotional, time, and financial strain abuse and neglect cases has on our State, on Public Defender Services, and on our Public Defender Office. The number of hours each action takes on an attorney is large, and a lot of times exceeds the hours spent preparing for and having a felony jury trial. Additionally, when a parent's rights are terminated, we file an appeal of that termination to the West Virginia Supreme Court.

Obviously, this workload is difficult for the attorney assigned to do the work but these actions affect every public defender. When you are representing a client on criminal charges who is also a party in an abuse and neglect action you have to be aware of what is being required of your client in that action to effectively represent them in their criminal case. You are also placed in the position when you are advising them that although one course of action would be best in their criminal action that it will negatively affect them in trying to be reunited with their children.

So, as the West Virginia Legislature considers increasing fund for more CPS workers, attention to funding needs for Public Defender Services needs to also be increased. There is a need to fund the payment of panel attorneys who handle these cases and increase funding to Public Defender Offices so that these time-consuming cases can be properly staffed. A solution also needs to be found to balance the workload of our Circuit Court Judges so that their job is bearable. This is a crisis.

Public Defender Corporation for the Thirteenth Judicial Circuit


Having opened in 1989, the Kanawha County Public Defender Office has spent close to thirty years providing high quality legal representation to indigent persons charged with crimes in Kanawha County by protecting their freedoms and rights, zealously advocating for their liberty, and promoting the fair administration of justice.

The office currently employs twenty-three full-time lawyers, one part-time senior counsel and two grant-funded lawyers. The support staff consists of fifteen regular full-time employees and one part-time United Way grant funded Community Resource Coordinator. The office appears in

Charleston and South Charleston Municipal, Kanawha County Magistrate, and Circuit courts, representing clients charged with felonies, misdemeanors, and juvenile delinquency. Our

attorneys also represent clients in involuntary commitment proceedings, contempt proceedings, and sit on both the Juvenile and Adult Drug Court teams. This year, we opened 6,819 new cases.

While our primary responsibility is to our clients facing the loss of their liberty, we are involved in making our community fair and just for all of those impacted by the criminal legal system. Kanawha County Public Defenders are active in the legal community, serving as committee and board members and as faculty for continuing legal education providers. Members of our legal staff participate in national and West Virginia DUI defense lawyer associations and are on the faculties of the Public Defender College hosted by the Kentucky Department of Public Advocacy and Gideon's Promise, a national public defender training organization, and conduct training locally and statewide on various legal topics.

Members of our support team are also active in criminal justice outreach and reform, including acting as members of the Kanawha County Re-entry Council, helping our clientele with barriers they face integrating back into society after incarceration, and advocating before the legislature for the passage of legislation beneficial to former inmates.

In addition to their legal work, our employees are involved in many activities intended to serve our community. Many are active in animal rescue. Others participate in community youth activities, serving as a Den Leader of a local Cub Scout troop, acting a foster parent, and volunteering at bible camps. Still others act as team parent for a local school soccer team, volunteer at food drives, participate in online help groups for people who are struggling with addiction, and assist with clinic support for Remote Area Medical, who provide free dental, vision and medical services.

Public Defender Corporation for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit

The Public Defender Corporation for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit (Harrison County) continues to provide legal representation to the indigent individuals who appear before any one of the three Circuit Judges, two Family Court Judges, five Magistrates, and two mental hygiene commissioners.

We started the year with an attorney vacancy, but had the pleasure in October 2018 of hosting Zachary Gary as a post graduate fellow with the West Virginia Fund for Law in the Public Interest for a year. His addition brought the number of attorneys in the office to six. Within the office, each attorney is assigned a case on a rotational basis and may be responsible for any type of case the office receives. We continue to handle a majority of the felony, misdemeanor and juvenile matters initiated in Harrison County courts. Successful jury verdicts this year have included Bryan Church's acquittal on a forgery and uttering charge; Susan Morris' verdict of voluntary manslaughter on a first-degree murder charge, and her verdict of petit larceny on a first degree robbery charge. Johnna Shumate and Bryan also successfully negotiated a plea to voluntary manslaughter on a first-degree murder charge.

From a personnel standpoint, Cheryl Taylor joined our staff as a secretary. Cheryl had previously worked for over a decade with a private panel attorney who retired.

Efforts continued within the office to assist those clients dealing with addiction. To that end, Patrick McFarland, our investigator also became designated as our treatment coordinator. Since his designation, he has obtained several substance use treatment beds for our clients and had established a good working relationship with treatment facilities within the state and other community support agencies within the North Central West Virginia area. His persistent communication, internally and externally, has served our clients well.

During the year, progress was also made to begin a Veteran's Treatment Court in the county. Several meetings were held with Judges, prosecutor representatives, probation representatives, and Veteran's Outreach Program representatives to lay the groundwork for a fall 2019 launch.

The Public Defender Corporation for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit continues to be appreciative to the West Virginia University College of Law. During the year, we have worked with the Immigration Law Clinic to resolve immigration and citizenship issues faced by some clients. Additionally, the West Virginia Law in the Public Interest and the Public Interest Advocates have allowed us the opportunity to host, at their cost, a Sprouse fellow during the summer. This year we hosted Ellen Walburn who had the opportunity to practice under Rule 10.

We hope that our office can continue to make a positive impact in the lives of our clients, as well as the community we serve.

The Public Defender Corporation for the Eighteenth (18th) Judicial Circuit of Preston County, West Virginia has its office located at 202 Tunnelton Street, Suite 303, Kingwood, West Virginia. Our office was established in the year 2000, and it serves the population of Preston County.

Our office consists of a Chief Public Defender, two associate staff attorneys, and two support personnel. We consider our staff our greatest asset in serving to meet the needs of our indigent population through our representation in their cases and consequently our brief involvement in their lives and the lives of their families. As a single judge circuit, our appointments are made by Judge Steven L. Shaffer for felonies and misdemeanors in Magistrate and Circuit Courts. All three attorneys share equally in every category of cases we are assigned.

Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-third Judicial Circuit

The Mission of the Eastern Panhandle Public Defender Office (EPPDO) is to provide competent, thoroughly professional legal representation to the indigent criminally accused in all Courts in the Twenty-third (23rd) Judicial Circuit of West Virginia in an efficient, cost-effective manner when appointed to do so by competent judicial authority.

Our clientele primarily consists of defendants in criminal matters at the felony and misdemeanor levels in Circuit and Magistrate Court, but the obligation to provide professional, competent legal representation extends to and includes appointments to represent offending respondents in parental rights termination matters ("abuse and neglect" cases), Family Law Court contempt proceedings, juvenile offender matters and mental hygiene involuntary commitment proceedings, as well as appellate matters at various levels when assigned to do so by a Court, to include prosecuting appeals in the WV Supreme Court of Appeals.

The EPPDO office responsibilities include all the courts in all three county jurisdictions in the Eastern Panhandle (Berkeley, Jefferson and Morgan), as well as seven individual municipal courts in various towns throughout the Panhandle, particularly Martinsburg's Municipal Court. Our two separate offices are located in Martinsburg, which covers all matters in Berkeley and Morgan counties, and a satellite office in Charles Town, which handles all matters in Jefferson County.

Established nearly thirty years ago and operating continuously since, we are the second largest Public Defender Corporation in West Virginia with a staff of 33 individuals: 20 licensed attorneys and 13 clerical support staff members and investigators. The team at the EPPDO is a committed, dedicated crew, truly devoted to ensuring that our clients of all types are treated justly: we fiercely protect the rights of poor, often powerless and are somehow enmeshed in other legal difficulties touching upon fundamental rights, thus ensuring that the criminal justice system is administered fairly, remains open, accessible and even-handed -- and is perceived as such by the general public and citizenry that we serve. We ensure that the everyday-person accused of wrongdoing by a powerful government and police apparatus is not overwhelmed and unduly intimidated and that his or her voice and "side of the story" is told by a tenacious, professional advocate committed to his or her cause. As Chief Public Defender, and a veteran of nearly twenty years in the trenches at the EPPDO, I am supremely confident that we are well-regarded and respected by all the judges and opposing counsel in our bailiwick. We are the proverbial "overworked and underpaid" public servants: despite staggering caseloads —well above and greatly surpassing ABA guideline levels - and extremely low compensation relative to our peers in the local prosecutors' offices, we enjoy very low turnover among the staff and have accrued a level of experience and expertise unrivaled in the State: a devoted team of career Public Defenders serving the State and her people and Courts.

Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-fifth Judicial Circuit

The Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-Fifth Judicial Circuit serves both Boone and Lincoln counties. The combined effort of six attorneys and four office support staff is credited with closing 1294 cases in the prior fiscal year, at an average cost of \$595 per case. Each client, however, presents a unique set of circumstances and our offices work diligently to provide individualized and effective legal representation to all. Enough cannot be said for the tremendous effort and determination our folks put forth each and every day.

Three years ago, leadership and procedural changes within the corporation reframed the expectations of our legal pursuit. Collaborative effort and embracing change, together facilitated a successful, initial restructuring. In the following year, our staff's continued dedication to the mission realized additional resources to address clients' growing mental health needs. Over the past year, sustained success, both in the courtroom and in substance use disorder recovery, has been achieved through the collective efforts of our entire team. In the words of Henry Ford, "coming together is a beginning, staying together is progress, and working together is success."

At present, our corporation operates offices in both Boone and Lincoln counties. The Lincoln County office, sited in Hamlin, is staffed by two attorneys, one secretary, and one recovery coach. Our senior attorney in Hamlin, H.C. Woods, has been an employee of the corporation since its inception in 2000. Presently, he counsels all misdemeanor and abuse/neglect clients and safeguards defendants' rights as a member of the Lincoln County Drug Court treatment panel. Support staff needs in the Lincoln County office are fulfilled by Delena Toler and Crissey Ryan. The two divide their attention weekly between the Madison and Hamlin offices. Delena and Crissey demonstrate their dedication, commuting from Madison to Hamlin every other week, in support of our Lincoln County clients and Hamlin based attorneys. In July of 2019, Mallory Sutphin, previously a part-time, grant-funded recovery coach in Boone County, earned a newly created full-time recovery coach position serving Lincoln, Cabell, and Wayne counties. We are enthusiastic that Lincoln County clients now can benefit from her extensive knowledge in substance use disorder and recovery.

The Boone County Office, situated on Main Street in Madison, staffs four attorneys, two secretaries, one office manager, and one recovery coach. The senior attorney in our Madison office is David Lockwood. David, a seventeen-year member of the team, brings considerable trial experience to the courtroom, recently achieving a hung jury in a voluntary manslaughter mistrial. David also adeptly serves as interim defender in Lincoln County felony cases, until an attorney vacancy in the Hamlin Office is filled. Howard Nolen joined the Boone County office in 2005. He presently manages all misdemeanor cases appointed to our Boone County office. With years of experience, Howard is astute in negotiating favorable pleas and fostering alternative resolutions in magistrate court. Troy Adams joined the corporation as Chief Public Defender in 2016. Since then, he has focused his attention on felony cases, restructuring office operating procedures, and increasing the availability of mental health services to clients. Troy recently achieved a client's

full acquittal in a burglary jury trial. Our newest attorney, Kassie Ball, joined the Boone office in 2019. Kassie's primary focus comprises abuse/neglect, juvenile matters, and mental hygiene proceedings, but eagerly takes on any additional cases thrown her way.

Our Madison office support staff consists of Kathy Lane, Jeanna Butcher, Delena Toler, and Crissey Ryan. Kathy Lane, our Office Manager, is a nine-year member of the Madison team. Her office know-how and winning attitude are both readily apparent. When questions and obstacles arise, Kathy brings answers and solutions. Jeanna Butcher entered the Boone office in 2012. Alongside Kathy, she takes on behind the scenes tasks to equip our attorneys for court. Donna Watts recently joined our Madison office staff as a grant-funded, part-time recovery coach. Jim Gore, with over thirty years of managerial experience in the private sector and county administration, brings practical knowledge to the corporation. Jim is also appointed to the Boone Memorial Hospital Board of Directors. Wendle Cook manages the Cook and Cook Law Firm in Madison where he has practiced law for thirty years. Our newest member, Phoebe Harless, is President of the Lincoln County Commission.

Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit

The 28th Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation in Summersville was first established in 1983, making it the first public defender corporation in the state.

D. Mark Snyder, who passed away in 2018, was the first public defender employee in West Virginia. When he moved to Charleston, Cynthia Stanton was hired in October 1987. For the first seven years, Ms. Stanton was the only public defender in Nicholas County. In 1994, a decision in Charleston was made to hire an assistant public defender to work with Ms. Stanton and in the last twenty-four years, six attorneys have held this position. Kathleen B. Murphy was hired and began working in April 2019, and practices with a focus in abuse and neglect proceedings and juvenile matters. The 28th Judicial Circuit Public Defender has two attorneys and two administrative assistants. Kathy O'Dell has worked in the office for twenty-two years and now serves as the office manager. Theresa Cartwright began working for our corporation in 2015, after working many years in other law offices. Ms. Stanton is the longest serving public defender in the state and is responsible for all misdemeanor and felony cases served by this office, unless she has a conflict.

The 28th Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation has maintained an annual caseload of approximately 500-600 cases per year since Ms. Stanton has taken over. This office has been responsible for indigent representation in all areas of criminal defense eligible proceedings. Our office handles approximately 70% of all criminal applicants that are appointed in the county. We handle all mental hygiene hearings during work hours and at night unless we have a conflict. The attorneys handle all court appointments unless there is a co-defendant or similar conflict. Ms. Stanton appears in family court when appointed by the Family Court Judge. Drug Court was established in July 2016 and is currently active with over thirty (30) participants. We have graduated 16 participants from the Drug Court program, and we are in the process of trying to locate and set up a sober living house in Nicholas County. Ms. Stanton serves on the advisory committee and treatment team who meets weekly with the participants. Ms. Stanton is a member of the Board of Directors for the Community Corrections Board that oversees the Day Report Center and served as President until October 2017.

Our office has always had each attorney prepared and ready to conduct any kind of criminal work. Every attorney that has left the office is typically prepared to handle all types of criminal proceedings. The ability to accomplish this is based upon necessity as our Circuit only elects one judge and our attorneys must be available for all proceedings during the weekdays, weeknights, and weekends. In fact, several of our attorneys have subsequently served as assistant prosecutors, and of the five former assistant public defenders, one currently serves as the Chief Prosecuting Attorney in their circuit. Ms. Stanton also appeared at WVU College of Law on a panel about Justice in Appalachia with other defense attorneys last year and serves as chairperson of the Motion's Manual Committee charged with updating the criminal motions manual last revised in 2003.

We purchased and renovated our building at 723 Main Street in 1996 for \$50,000 and paid it off in 2003. Because we have not had to pay for rent, we have been able to use that money to better represent indigent clients.

At this point we believe that we have a sound system in place to address indigent clients in our circuit.

We also continue our commitment to be civically engaged. We establish a presence at as many and varied governmental meetings as possible. As former Kanawha County Chief Public Defender George Castelle once said, "It's not what you can accomplish by being present, it's about what won't happen because you are there."

One form of civic engagement has become somewhat of a tradition between our office and the Williamson Health and Wellness Center. Our Office

Our office opened for business on January 15, 1990. Since that time we've grown from a one attorney, one secretary office to a 4 attorney office with a clerical staff of three and a recovery coach. Our office handles approximately 500 cases a year, including felony, misdemeanor, juvenile and mental hygiene matters. Over the years our attorney staff has supervised 40+ law student interns from 10 different law schools, many of whom have chosen to practice law in West Virginia.

Lawyers

David Foley, our Chief Defender, and a former WV Public Defender of the Year, is a graduate of the WVU College of Law, and attended James Madison University where he was on the varsity debate team. David handles misdemeanors and felonies, and is our "go to guy" for extradition cases. David is an Executive Board Member and Trustee for the Coalfield Association of Southern Baptists, sings in his church choir, teaches Sunday school and Vacation Bible School and bowls competitively. He is happily married to Debbie.

Paul Montgomery, staff attorney, a U.S. Navy veteran, attended the University of Oklahoma and Appalachian School of Law. He handles misdemeanor and felony cases, is our point man for mental hygiene cases, and also handles some delinquency matters. He recently argued an appeal before the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals. Paul is married to Megan, and is the father of two young sons, Syrus Jonah and Royce Asher (aka Bobby Cars). Paul is a member of Delta Theta Phi Law fraternity. His hobby is stargazing from which all members of the office benefitted during the last total eclipse.

Will Duty, our newest attorney, is a graduate of Williamson High School, the University of Kentucky and Appalachian School of Law.
