## THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S PAGE



My letter in the 2020 Annual Report lauded the employees of Public Defender Services for their adaptability and resiliency in responding to the pandemic that arose during the latter half of the fiscal year. Unforeseeable was the resulting extended period during which such adaptability and flexibility were required. Indeed, employees reported to the office as a general matter only near the end of this fiscal year. And the reality is that the agency's operations have changed in many ways due to this process.

First, the voucher processing division demonstrably proved to be more efficient when working remotely. Many reasons can be expounded, but, most importantly, these employee's circumstances were better accommodated by working from a home office. Accordingly, the voucher processing function will now be a telecommuting position. Already, retention of these employees has been steady, and the readily measurable productivity has increased steadily.

Second, the agency's mandated collaborative approach in the appellate and habeas divisions was hampered by remote work. Accordingly, attorneys and legal staff were not given the option of telecommuting. While this was the correct decision, several attorneys resigned subsequently to accept positions with private firms making this accommodation (and, of course, offering higher compensation). However, the divisions have continued to provide zealous and effective representation, and new counsel have been provided meaningful opportunities for public service with the agency.

Third, the agency's legal education efforts will continue to take advantage of Zoom or its equivalents. Virtual conferences were held on a range of issues, such as cross-examination and habeas petitions, at no cost to defense counsel. A juvenile boot camp was devised for virtual attendance. A virtual series has been started focusing on the legends of the bar. This emphasis on virtual opportunities will continue into the next fiscal year.

Fourth, the agency has been vigilant in ensuring that criminal defendant's rights or parental rights are not degraded by increased usage of virtual medium for resolution of matters. A supreme court appeal confirmed that, if a defendant does not waive the right, the defendant is entitled to be sentenced in person, a pandemic notwithstanding. In other areas, the agency and its attorneys have zealously maintained the guardrails of due process during the push to a virtual courtroom.

Finally, the exclusion of public defenders and court-appointed counsel from the development of, and inclusion in, protocols during the emergency was a disappointment. In the courtroom, the

defense counsel and client were often the only unvaccinated participants. The task forces did not include public defense. For this, I shoulder the blame. I try to be the voice for this profession, but I have not yet been loud enough. For all the progress I thought was made, this was an unsettling setback.

In conclusion, the agency's mission remains, and the people dedicated to this mission have not been deterred during these unprecedented times. I am so proud to be their Executive Director.

## PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICES Historical Overview

### 1. The State of West Virginia's Constitutional Obligation.

Over fifty years ago, the Supreme Court of the United States recognized that:

[R]eason and reflection require us to recognize that in our adversary system of criminal justice, any person haled into court, who is too poor to hire a lawyer, cannot be assured a fair trial unless counsel is provided for him. This seems to us to be an obvious truth. Governments, both state and federal, quite properly spend vast sums of money to establish machinery to try defendants accused of crime. Lawyers to prosecute are everywhere deemed essential to protect the public's interest in an orderly society. ... The right of one charged with crime to counsel may not be deemed fundamental and essential to fair trials in some countries, but it is in ours. From the very beginning, our state and national constitutions and laws have laid great emphasis on procedural and substantive safeguards designed to assure fair trials before impartial tribunals in which every defendant stands equal before the law. This noble idea cannot be realized if the poor man charged with crime has to face his accusers without a lawyer to assist him.

*Gideon v. Wainwright*, 372 U.S. 335, 344, 83 S.Ct. 792 (1963). With this decision, the Supreme Court of the United States, through the Fourteenth Amendment, extended the Sixth Amendment guarantee of the assistance of counsel in criminal prosecutions to the states. Essentially, states had to provide counsel for persons who were too poor to pay for legal services when these persons were confronted with criminal charges or the loss of other important rights by reason of state action.

The Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia reaffirmed this constitutional mandate as follows:

“There can be no equal justice where the kind of trial a man gets depends on the amount of money he has. ...” *Griffin v. Illinois*, 351 U.S. 12, 76 S.Ct. 585, 100 L.Ed. 891 (1956). ... The state must, as a matter of equal protection, provide indigents with the basic tools for an adequate defense or appeal, when those tools are available for a price to others.

*State v. England*, 363 S.E.2d 725, 727 (W. Va. 1987). Accordingly, a defense must be provided to indigent defendants and the defense must include not only the services of the attorney, but the provision of other services and material, including the transcripts of proceedings. *Id.*

## 2. The Legislative Findings.

In 1981, the following was codified at W. Va. Code §29-21-1:

The Legislature finds and declares that in certain proceedings the state is required to provide high quality legal assistance to indigent persons who would be otherwise unable to afford adequate legal counsel; that providing legal representation to those who face an economic barrier to adequate legal counsel will serve the ends of justice in accordance with rights and privileges guaranteed to all citizens by the Constitution of the United States of America and the constitution of the state of West Virginia; that the availability of quality legal assistance reaffirms the faith of our citizens in our government of laws; that the present system which utilizes appointed counsel is not operating satisfactorily in some areas of this state and the Legislature is presently unable to determine what system or systems will provide the most efficient means for providing legal representation; that there is a need to explore alternative methods of delivering legal assistance, including the use of salaried public defenders complemented by private panel attorneys; that innovative programs and pilot projects as well as a continuation of the present appointed counsel system are necessary in separate areas of the state to provide information and experience upon which to base future legislative action.

The West Virginia Public Legal Services Council was then created “for the purpose of facilitating required legal representation of indigent persons”. W. Va. Code §29-21-3 (1981; superseded in 1989).

In 1989, the agency was renamed as Public Defender Services and was charged as follows:

The agency shall have as its principal purpose the development and improvement of programs by which the state provides legal representation to indigent persons.

W. Va. Code §29-21-4. This remains the agency’s charge.

## **PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICES**

### **An Organizational Overview**

**VISION:** *"There can be no equal justice where the kind of trial a man gets depends on the amount of money he has." Griffin v. Illinois, 351 U.S. 12 (1956)*

**MISSION STATEMENT:** To fulfill the State of West Virginia's constitutional obligation to provide quality legal assistance to persons who otherwise could not afford legal counsel in proceedings in which the person's liberty interests are at stake.

#### **ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE:**

Public Defender Services is within the Department of Administration for the State of West Virginia. The chief administrative officer is the Executive Director, who is appointed by the governor.

In addition to its administrative staff, the agency has five divisions.

The Accounting and Auditing Division is charged with the following responsibilities:

The agency shall establish and the executive director or his or her designee shall operate an accounting and auditing division to require and monitor the compliance with this article by public defender corporations and other persons or entities receiving funding or compensation from the agency. The accounting and auditing division shall review all plans and proposals for grants and contracts and shall make a recommendation of approval or disapproval to the executive director. The accounting and auditing division shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, reports concerning the evaluation, inspection or monitoring of public defender corporations and other grantees, contractors, persons or entities receiving financial assistance under this article and shall further carry out the agency's responsibilities for records and reports as set forth in section eighteen of this article. The accounting and auditing division shall require each public defender corporation to submit financial statements monthly and to report monthly on the billable and nonbillable time of its professional employees, including time used in administration of the respective offices, so as to compare the time to similar time expended in nonpublic law offices for similar activities. The accounting and auditing division shall provide to the executive director assistance in the fiscal administration of all of the agency's divisions. This assistance shall include, but not be limited to, budget preparation and statistical analysis.

W. Va. Code §29-21-6(d).

The Criminal Law Research Center is another division of the agency and has the following statutory charge:

- (1) Undertake research, studies and analyses and act as a central repository, clearinghouse and disseminator of research materials;
- (2) Prepare and distribute a criminal law manual and other materials and establish and implement standard and specialized training programs for attorneys practicing criminal law;
- (3) Provide and coordinate continuing legal education programs and services for attorneys practicing criminal law; and
- (4) Prepare, supplement and disseminate indices and digests of decisions of the West Virginia supreme court of appeals and other courts, statutes and other legal authorities relating to criminal law.

W. Va. Code §29-21-7.

The agency's third division, the Appellate Advocacy Division is established as follows:

The agency shall establish and the executive director or his or her designee shall operate an appellate advocacy division for the purpose of prosecuting litigation on behalf of eligible clients in the Supreme Court of Appeals. The executive director or his or her designee shall be the director of the appellate advocacy division. The appellate advocacy division shall represent eligible clients upon appointment by the circuit courts or by the Supreme Court of Appeals. The division may, however, refuse the appointments due to a conflict of interest or if the executive director has determined the existing caseload cannot be increased without jeopardizing the appellate division's ability to provide effective representation. In order to effectively and efficiently use the resources of the appellate division, the executive director may restrict the provision of appellate representation to certain types of cases. The executive director may select and employ staff attorneys to perform the duties prescribed by this subsection. The appellate division shall maintain records of representation of eligible clients for record purposes only.

W. Va. Code §29-21-6(e).

The agency's fourth division, the Appointed Counsel Services Division, contains the voucher processing staff that processes for payment the vouchers which are submitted by private attorneys who accept appointments in eligible proceedings, which are defined as follows:

Criminal charges which may result in incarceration; juvenile proceedings; proceedings to revoke parole or probation if the revocation may result in incarceration; contempt of court; child abuse and neglect proceedings which may result in a termination of

parental rights; mental hygiene commitment proceedings; extradition proceedings; proceedings which are ancillary to an eligible proceeding, including, but not limited to, proceedings to enhance sentences brought pursuant to sections eighteen and nineteen, article eleven, chapter sixty-one of this code, forfeiture proceedings brought pursuant to article seven, chapter sixty-a of this code, and proceedings brought to obtain extraordinary remedies; and appeals from or post-conviction challenges to the final judgment in an eligible proceeding. Legal representation provided pursuant to the provisions of this article is limited to the court system of the state of West Virginia, but does not include representation in municipal courts unless the accused is at risk of incarceration . . . .

W. Va. Code §29-21-2(2). A “help desk” is also part of the division and is designed to assist attorneys with the preparation of vouchers.

The agency’s fifth division is the Public Defender Corporation Resource Center, which is dedicated to providing services to the administrators of, and attorneys within, the eighteen public defender corporations operating throughout the state. The Center is a recognition that not every public defender corporation can support or fund certain positions critical to the representation of a client. Also, the Center is a recognition that the corporations, while separate entities, must maintain uniform systems centralized within the agency in order to maximize the funding made available through legislative appropriation. Accordingly, the Center houses a criminal justice specialist, a juvenile resource specialist, an administrator, and a program assistant.

In addition to the agency’s divisions, the statutory framework for the agency includes two additional entities.

### **Indigent Defense Commission.**

The first is the Indigent Defense Commission. Specifically,

- (a) There is hereby established the Indigent Defense Commission to provide assistance to Public Defender Services with regard to the general policies and procedures of the agency, including, but not limited to, the opening, closing or merging of public defender offices throughout the state and the establishment of performance measures for the qualitative review of indigent defense.
- (b) In order to demonstrate a collaborative approach to solving criminal justice problems, the commission shall consist of the Executive Director of Public Defender Services, who shall serve as chair, and the following members appointed by the Governor:

- (1) One former or retired circuit judge;
  - (2) Three lawyers, one from each congressional district, who have significant experience in the defense of criminal cases or have demonstrated a strong commitment to quality representation of indigent defendants;
  - (3) One current chief public defender; [...],
  - (4) One nonlawyer with a demonstrated commitment to providing legal services to the indigent;
  - (5) One person who is a member of an organization that advocates on behalf of people with mental illness and developmental disabilities; and
  - (6) One attorney with significant experience in the defense of juvenile delinquency and abuse and neglect cases.
- (c) The commission shall meet at the times and places specified by the call of the chair: Provided, That the commission shall meet no less than four times each year. Members shall serve without compensation but may receive reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses for each day or portion thereof engaged in this discharge of official duties in a manner consistent with the guidelines of the Travel Management Office of the Department of Administration.
- ...
- (f) The commission has the following powers and duties:
- (1) To develop standards regarding the qualifications and training for public defenders, assistant public defenders and staff;
  - (2) To explore opportunities related to the training of appointed panel attorneys;
  - (3) To evaluate, on an annual basis, the compensation and caseloads of public defenders and appointed panel attorneys;
  - (4) To develop standards for providing and compensating expert witnesses, investigators and other persons who provide services related to legal representation under this article;

- (5) To study, monitor and evaluate existing standards for determining eligibility for legal representation under section sixteen of this article;
- (6) To study the feasibility and need of creating additional public defender corporations, the activation of public defender corporations and the formation of multicircuit or regional public defender corporations in accordance with the provisions of section eight of this article;
- (7) To study the potential for the dissolution of public defender corporations;
- (8) To study, monitor, evaluate and make recommendations regarding the training, experience and background necessary for a public defender or panel attorney to competently represent indigent defendants in capital cases; and
- (9) To monitor and make recommendations regarding the following activities of the board of directors of each public defender corporation receiving funding pursuant to this article:
  - (A) The appointment of the public defender and any assistant public defenders pursuant to subdivision (1), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article;
  - (B) The fixing of professional and clerical salaries pursuant to subdivision (2), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article; and
  - (C) The removal of any public defender, assistant public defender or other employee for misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance pursuant to subdivision (3), subsection (c), section fifteen of this article.

W. Va. Code §29-21-3b.

### **Public Defender Corporations.**

The second entity is the public defender corporation, which, if active within a judicial circuit, is “to provide legal representation ... in accordance with the provisions” of the governing statute. W. Va. Code §29-21-8(a)(2).

For each public defender corporation, a board of directors is appointed. The chairperson of the board is appointed by the governor. One to two members for each county in the judicial circuit are appointed by the county commission. One to two additional members are appointed by each county bar association within the judicial circuit. The board selects a “chief” public defender who is then responsible for the delivery of legal services by the corporation. Unless inconsistent with the governing statute, the provisions of the state’s nonprofit corporate laws govern the public defender corporations.

*In 1961, a Florida court refused to provide a public defender for Clarence Earl Gideon, who was accused of robbery. Gideon appealed his conviction to the US Supreme Court on the grounds that the Fourteenth Amendment incorporated the Sixth Amendment's right to counsel to the states. The Supreme Court ruled in Gideon's favor, requiring states to provide a lawyer to any defendant who could not afford one.*

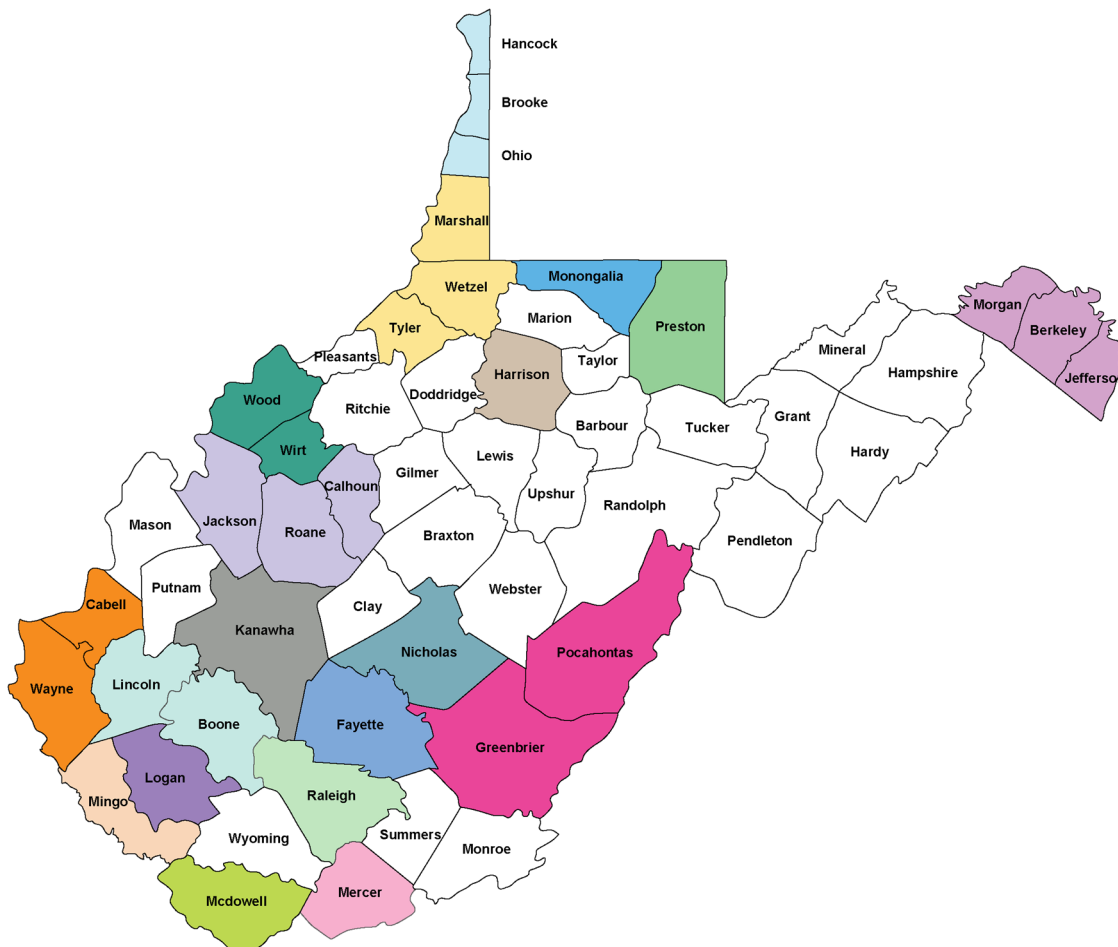

## West Virginia Public Defender Corporations (PDCs) 31 Counties Served by 19 PDCs

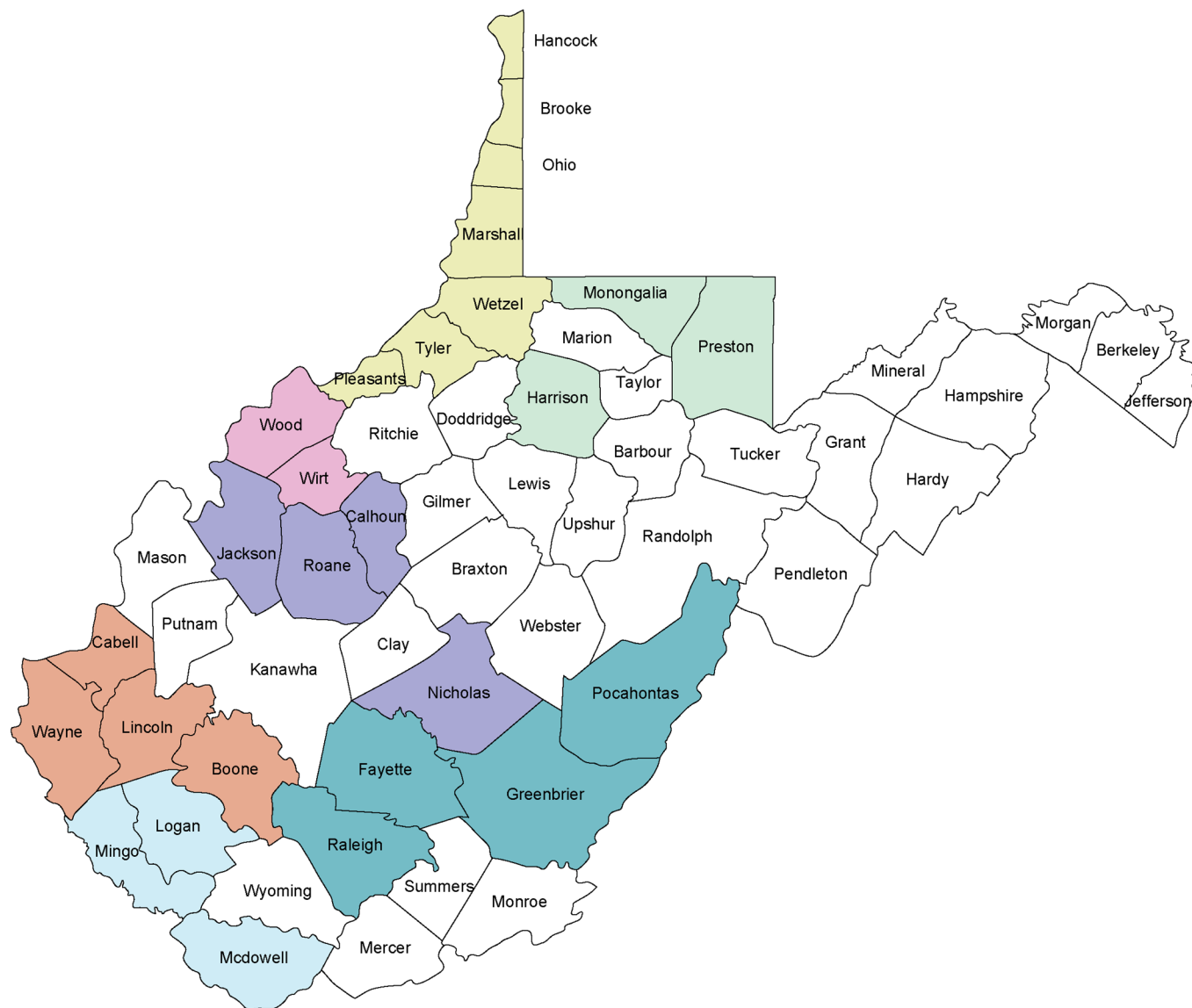

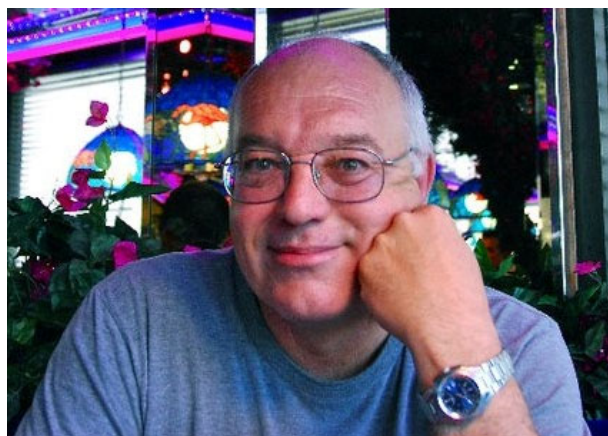
## **Public Defender Corporation for the First Judicial Circuit**

Under the direction of our 9-member Board of Directors, the First Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation is a client focused non-profit organization operating in the Northern Panhandle of West Virginia. In order to meet the demands of justice in our tri-county circuit, we employ nine full time attorneys representing decades of combined legal experience. Our attorneys are supported through five non-lawyer staff associates and a peer recovery coach. Our attorneys and staff are split among two offices located in Wheeling and Weirton.

### **Mission Statement**

Provide direct representation of indigent citizens accused by the government of crimes against the state. We do this well—*Everyone knows what we bring!* Our secondary mission focuses on preserving the Rule of Law. *Gideon* correctly states that attorneys are not luxuries but necessities. Our profession of law dictates that we are the social trustees for the rule of law. To that end, we aim to use our collective expertise only in the best interests of our clients and society.

### **Happy Retirement**



Of significant note and loss to the Corporation, is the retirement of Keith Hart. Mr. Hart served many years with the First Judicial Circuit in both the Wheeling and Weirton. A true believer in protecting the rights of the indigent, Mr. Hart spent a lifetime challenging injustice and oppression. Mr. Hart's quick wit, courtroom temperament, and sense of justice stand as testament to all our profession holds dear. An incomparable wealth of legal knowledge and experience, Mr. Hart served as both a mentor and a friend. While Mr. Hart's position might be replaced, he remains irreplaceable. We wish Mr. Hart well in retirement.

### **By the Numbers**

In FY 19, our Corporation handled nearly 60% of felony offenses involving indigent persons in the First Judicial Circuit. In addition to other actions such as parole revocations and miscellaneous matters, we represented nearly 86% of misdemeanors and 72% of juvenile cases requiring appointed counsel. Our cost per case remains \$620.85 lower than panel attorneys. These raw numbers provide the best evidence of our cost effectiveness.<sup>1</sup>

During his deployment, LTC Welling served as the legal advisor for the Special Operations Advisory Group (SOAG) working with the Legal and Judicial Directorates of the Iraqi Counter-Terrorism Service (CTS) and the Iraqi Counter Terrorism Command (CTC) during their fight against Da'esh (ISIS).

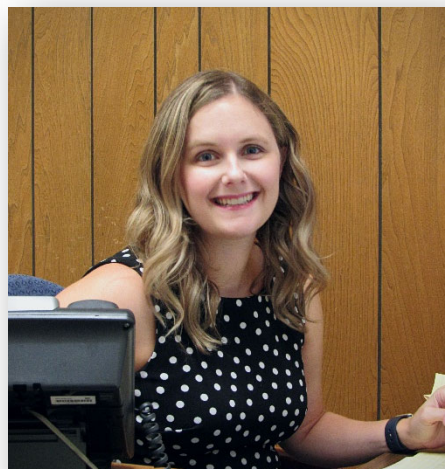

## Public Defender Corporation for the Fourth Judicial Circuit

This will be my final contribution to the annual report. In December of 2021, I am wrapping up this phase of my career and I'm moving on, hanging it up, leaving the building (and whatever other cliches for retirement there are).

I have been the first and only Public Defender in the Fourth Circuit since 2015 when I was entrusted by the Board with the task of opening this office for Wood and Wirt Counties, an opportunity for which I am extremely grateful. The Fourth Circuit Public Defender office opened for business on January 1, 2016, over five years ago.

While I had practiced criminal law for many years as a criminal defense attorney and a prosecutor before that, my experience with the public defender system was virtually nonexistent. As a private practitioner, I could pick and choose the criminal cases and the clients I represented. I quickly learned that a Public Defender has no such luxury - only ineligibility for services and the occasional conflict eliminates clients from being represented.

I have now witnessed “public defending” up close and personal. I see it for the difficult and often exhausting and frustrating undertaking that it is. Our clients are not just in trouble and afraid. Some are battling mental illness; others are homeless or trying to get clean and recover from substance use problems. Some can't read or write. Some get angry and lash out. Some are estranged from their families and have no one to talk to or support them, no transportation, and no phone. Many are distrustful of the system and of their lawyer.

Add to that list the economic fallout, the pressures, and the enormous emotional toll the pandemic has inflicted upon everyone since March 2020. To say that it's overwhelming at times hardly begins to scratch the surface and describe the enormity of the job of being a public defender. It's hard to know from day to day who you might encounter, what their particular problems are going to be and what obstacles they are facing, or if that client will take your advice or sabotage their own case as so many do.

It has been quite an education. Even though I had many years of experience in abuse and neglect cases, nothing prepared me for the cases I've handled as a Public Defender. Attending hearing after hearing after hearing and thinking my client might possibly be able to have their kids returned only to have the rug yanked out from under them at the last moment. Then writing briefs for appeals in these cases, submitting wheelbarrow-loads of documents- all it often seems for nothing. That's when I have to repeatedly remind myself how important those hearings and months and years of effort are, even when clients do not prevail. That's because the fight itself matters - it guarantees the existence and continuation of a process that is vitally important not just to our clients, but to our society.

So, I salute public defenders all over West Virginia and the country for battling for the rights of people that many don't think matter. I applaud the good work being done at WV Public Defender Services and thank them for all of their support and help. In my own little part of the world, I salute Brad Frum for his tireless efforts in helping to keep this office running. I thank Joe McFarland for his trial acumen and wisdom, and Hannah West and Nancy McGhee for their caring hearts and spirits. I am grateful to

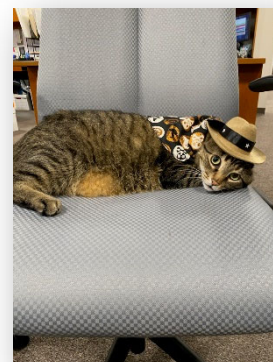

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Fifth Judicial Circuit**

### **Organization's History:**

The Public Defender Corporation held its first board meeting on the 31st day of July 1996 and includes the 5th Judicial Circuit of Calhoun, Roane, Jackson, and Mason counties in West Virginia. However, during the process the Mason County Bar brought a lawsuit against the corporation and was granted an injunction for operation in Mason County. At the time, the injunction was not challenged and the corporation along with Public Defender Services made the mutual decision not to litigate the injunction as Public Defender Services and the corporation being in their infancies and it was agreed it was more important to firmly establish the corporation and Public Defender Services generally. To this day the injunction has not been challenged.

### **Organizational Goals and Objectives:**

Our goal is to provide high quality legal assistance to indigent persons who would be otherwise unable to afford adequate legal counsel; to provide legal representation to those who face an economic barrier to adequate legal counsel that will serve the ends of justice in accordance with rights and privileges guaranteed to all citizens by the constitution of the United States of America and the constitution of the state of West Virginia; to make available quality legal assistance that reaffirms the faith of our citizens in our government of laws.

The objective is to protect the ordinary citizen from wrongful conviction and to protect the basic and fundamental rights of all citizens by navigating those individuals charged with crimes through an evolving and complex legal system. A conviction based on sound law and tested facts with competent counsel is rarely overturned by the courts whereby society as a whole is protected by protecting individual rights.

### **Programs and Services:**

Pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-8(a)(2) the purpose of a public defender corporation is to provide legal representation in the respective circuits in accordance with the provisions of that article. To that end, we provide appointed counsel in felony, misdemeanor, abuse and neglect, juvenile delinquency, juvenile status offenses, family court contempt when jail is contemplated, and mental hygiene proceedings.

### **Organizational Structure (board, staff, volunteers):**

The Board of Directors is organized pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-15 consisting of a chairperson appointed by the Governor, two members from each county in which the corporation operates for a total of seven members. (A lawyer and non-lawyer each from Jackson, Roane, and Calhoun counties with a chairperson from Roane County.)

The board oversees the corporation pursuant to W. Va. Code §29-21-15. The chief public defender reports to the board of directors, each of the assistant public defenders and staff members report to the chief public defender. The chief public defender is ethically responsible for the conduct of the

assistant public defenders and the staff pursuant to Rules 5.1 and 5.3 of the West Virginia Rules of Professional Conduct (2013) for lawyers.

There are currently three office staff members which includes the office manager. In addition, there are seven lawyers which includes the chief public defender.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Sixth & Twenty-fourth Judicial Circuits**

The Public Defender Corporation for the 6th and 24th Judicial Circuits was founded on July 1, 1994. For the first time since inception, words such as “pandemic”, “COVID”, and “quarantine” that were never spoken before were now used on a daily basis. FY 2021 proved to be a challenge like no other. New rules and protocols within the office were established to try and keep each other safe from the virus. Like everyone else, we struggled to represent individuals in a court system that was also learning how to deal with the pandemic. Attorneys working from home while the court conducted hearings via Zoom or other virtual platform, became the new normal. It was a learning curve that at times proved difficult, but also brought us together to work harder as a team. It was definitely a learn as you go experience.

During the fiscal year, the Huntington office closed 3,083 cases. Of those, 1,100 were felonies and 1,663 were misdemeanors. The Wayne office closed 755 cases. Of those, 297 were felonies and 314 were misdemeanors. There are 11 attorneys and 5 support staff in the Huntington office, and in Wayne, 3 attorneys and 1 support staff. Our felony case load continues to climb due in large part to the number of drug and drug related cases. Recovery Coach Mallory Sutphin has been instrumental in relieving some of the pressure associated with helping our clients who are addicted to drugs get into recovery programs. Numerous programs and facilities continue to open in the City of Huntington and the surrounding area to combat and overcome the overwhelming drug epidemic crisis. Our offices continue to be active in the Adult Drug Court as well as the Day Report Center Bond Review Committee in both counties.

Even during this unprecedented time, the Public Defender Corporation for the 6th and 24th Circuits strives to provide quality representation for our clients. Historically, our district continues to be one of the leading Public Defender offices in cost effective representation.

We also welcomed two new attorneys to the Huntington office: Brittany Dolan and Annelie Stallings. Brittany came to us fresh out of law school. She successfully passed the Bar Exam on her first try and officially become an Assistant Public Defender. Brittany graduated from WVU and interned for the Honorable William Hare at the Beaver County Courthouse, as well as a Sprouse Fellow at the Harrison County Public Defender’s office. She hit the ground running and soon became an invaluable team member.

Annelie Stallings came to work for us in October, 2020, to fill a vacant position left by PD veteran Russ Cook. Annelie graduated Magna Cum Laude from the Louisville Brandeis School of Law, and received the CALI award for highest grade in Professional Responsibility. She is licensed to practice law in the States of West Virginia and Kentucky. Annelie served in the US Army National Guard as a Healthcare Specialist/Combat Medic, and Aviation Operations Specialist from 2003-2008. She was an Honor Graduate in the Combat Medical Course, and a Distinguished Graduate in the Aviation Operations Specialist Class. We are honored to have Annelie as a member of our Team.

A shining light during the FY 2021 fiscal year was the Legislative approval for much needed and deserved raises for all of the Public Defender Corporations. Special thanks to Ronni Sheets, Chief Public Defender for the 13<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit for her hard work and non-stop efforts in getting this accomplished.

Although FY 2021 proved to be a challenging year and tested us in ways we never thought possible, I am proud of our staff for rising to the challenge and working together as a team.

We opened and closed a lot of cases but more importantly we helped save the lives of clients while simultaneously protecting their rights.

It was a year of rotating between in person and Microsoft Teams/Video Hearings which brought unique hurdles. We also believe we were and are helping to put newer programs into place that will help save the lives of our clients and ultimately help West Virginia as a whole deal with the deadly substance use disorder/drug addiction epidemic. Fentanyl and Meth have made our jobs more difficult than ever, but we have faced the challenge with the help of Public Defender Services and various organizations that are rising to help people who have been stricken with substance use disorder.

### ***7TH CIRCUIT TEAM: A Small Office with a Highly Qualified Team***

Dwayne has been the Chief Public Defender for the Seventh Circuit (Logan County) since 2005. He currently is a member of the Southern Regional Day Report Centers Board of Directors, covering Logan, Lincoln, Boone, and Mingo counties. He is the representative for defense attorneys on the Drug Court Team for Logan County. Outside of work-related roles, Dwayne is also on the Logan Library Board and is interested in promoting literacy programs and programs for youth. He is also actively involved with the local swim team where he can act as an official or starter and gets involved in fund raising for the REC Center Team.

Referring to Carol as the "Administrative Right Hand" is not an exaggeration. She is the go-to

person for computer problems, filing problems, and steps up to volunteer whenever teams are put together in Charleston to review possible new programs and ideas. She has been an administrative assistant since 1997 and has been the office administrator since 2005. She helps train new staff including new attorneys and plays a crucial role in being the initial contact person between the many offices with which we must do business like our accountant, bank, and Board of Directors.

***PAMELA ESPOSITO, Administrative Assistant***

Pam has been with the office since 2005. She primarily assists Gerald but is always happy to get involved and help everyone who needs it. Her experience, skill, and sunny personality are a big help in dealing with difficult clients and issues. She continues to work hard at the daily grind of keeping schedules straight and opening and closing cases and typing tons of documents for the lawyers.

***CRYSTAL CANTERBURY, Administrative Assistant***

Crystal is our newest administrative assistant, but she has very quickly adapted to our office. She has proven to have fantastic organizational skills and an aggressive “get things done attitude”. She has great people skills and quickly adapts to dealing with difficult family members who often call our office. She has been of great help in keeping everyone on task and everyone making meetings and hearings and deadlines on time as she is very calendar conscious.

***TYSON COMPTON, Recovery Coach***

We share a Recovery Coach with Mingo County. Tyson has proven that the Recovery Coach program saves lives. He plays a central role in getting our clients into both inpatient and outpatient treatment including emergency treatment when needed. I have personally been involved in many cases where I believe it is undeniable that he saved the life of the client he was working with. The data cannot possibly reflect what that means and the significance of his contribution. We hope that the program can be expanded so that each PDC has a recovery coach dedicated solely to that office’s clients.

**ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE FISCAL YEAR**

We opened 828 cases, including 396 Felonies; 144 Misdemeanor; 15 Juvenile; 63 Parole/Probation Revocations; 41 Termination Abuse; 6 Mental Hygiene; 3 Habeas Sup Court; 160 Other.

We closed 827 cases, including 389 Felonies; 154 Misdemeanor; 24 Juvenile; 65 Parole/Probation Revocations; 40 Termination Abuse; 7 Mental Hygiene; 1 Habeas Sup Court; 147 Other.

This was doing a period of lockdown to no-lockdown and the statistics do not adequately represent what we do. We protect the constitutional rights of our clients in the traditional way that a good criminal defense lawyer does, but we also now are directly involved in saving the lives of our clients who are severely addicted and that is day to day operations. It is not an exaggeration to say that we acquire multiple treatment beds for clients every week. This takes a team effort as lawyers must get things approved in Court and the Recovery Coach and Secretaries must get the information the lawyer needs to present to the Judges and sometimes Magistrates.

It is also important to note that during the various stages of the Covid 19 Pandemic we made certain our clients Rights to various hearings were maintained and timely kept. We used the video communications system to speed the process up and in certain appropriate situations we made certain that hearings occurred in person.

## **CONSISTENT COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT**

Our Staff continues to contribute to the Logan County Community ranging from helping youth athletic programs and libraries to being active Church members and helping abused and neglected animals.

While we are proud of our work in the Public Defender’s Office, we also like to be active in our community. Examples include but are not limited to my participation on the Library Board and involvement with to the Logan County Swim Team, Pam’s participation in the “Paw Squad” animal rescue group, Crystal’s involvement with Logan High’s baseball team

The Logan County Rec Center Swim Team recruits young kids throughout the County to participate on a Swim Team that covers ages from 4 to 18. The Swim Team travels and is part of U.S.A. swimming. Dwayne participates by helping be a “starter” and sometimes assisting in being a “referee” and by helping with Fund Raising Efforts getting community leaders involved.

“Paw Squad” is a very functional animal rescue organization with contacts across the United States. The number of animals that have been saved by their efforts is amazing. They find new homes, foster homes, get vet care, and transport to other states. Pam Esposito and her husband have been central member so that group and they get community help including help of other member of our office from time to time.

Athletics is a big part of Logan County, and our office has been part of that community over the years. Currently Crystal is the most active member of that community as her son is an athlete at Logan High. As anyone who deals with children’s sports know there must be consistent involvement of adults to make those programs work and Crystal is a big part of that community from working concessions and clean up to fund raisers.

Our local Logan Library is an important part of the community as it provides not only access to hard books but electronic information and all that comes with it. The library also has many programs for kids and adults, from reading programs to art programs. Dwayne has been an active member of their Board of Directors

This was just a snapshot of community involvement and some examples. Our staff have all been active members of the Logan County Community and varying levels throughout the years. With our current staff and team that will only increase going forward.

## **COMMUNITY PARTNERS AND HELP FROM UNEXPECTED PLACES**

A narrative about the fiscal year does not seem complete without noting our community partners and help that we got through the year.

### ***COMMUNITY PARTNERS***

Public Defender Services has been of great help to us in the trying times of COVID and the ever-growing Drug Addiction/Substance Use Disorder Epidemic. Mr. Eddy and his team including but not limited to Jonathan, Jessica, and Stephanne made themselves available to us for questions and concerns during the unusual times and normal times. Without the support and help of Public Defender Services these jobs would be so much more difficult than they are. Help with services for our clients and organizational and financial questions were always timely pursued by their office.

The Day Report Center has provided an umbrella of services for our clients that are really such an improvement from that past when such services were not available. From Drug Court, Teen Drug Court, Family Treatment Court, and Fresh Start the services to our clients that help keep them out of prison and the grave have been tremendous.

There are too many substance abuse facilities both outpatient and inpatient that have helped us to name them all, but names like Union Mission, Recovery Point, Pretera, Anchor Point, Anchor Project, and HAWC instantly come to mind. Without them, many of our clients would be in jail, prison, or dead.

### ***HELP FROM UNEXPECTED PLACES***

A Regional Jail would certainly qualify as an unexpected place to get a compliment from a Public Defender. However, I would also like to note that our Regional Jail the Southwestern Regional Jail and Correctional Center was extremely helpful in providing access to our clients during the COVID periods by either giving in person, no contact, or video. They did these things for us on very little notice. While I may complain next week about something I believe they did not do properly, it is very appropriate for me to compliment them on the access to client's issue as that was not the experience everywhere that we dealt with as we have clients in other facilities throughout this State and even occasionally in other states and federal facilities.

### **CHANGES AND THE FUTURE**

This year we saw the retirement of Don McDaniel our Ivy League Graduate and the departure of Ashley Cochrane who is now an assistant prosecuting attorney. We saw the addition of Robert Evans and the increasing involvement of our recovery coach and the beginnings of a shared social worker program. As our treatment programs grow our active involvement in these programs will increase. We must remain committed to opening new doors for our clients so that the prison doors do not close behind them.

The Public Defender Corporation for the Ninth Judicial Circuit recently celebrated 30 years of operation. The office consists of seven attorneys and six support staff. When the courts reopened our attorneys participated in hearings remotely and in person, including mental hygiene hearings in area hospitals. Mercer County has three Circuit Court Judges, five Magistrates, and two Municipal Courts. Our office represents indigent defendants charged with felonies and misdemeanors, which a sentence of incarceration may be imposed. We represent juveniles in delinquency, truancy, and status offender cases; and primarily parents in child abuse and neglect matters. The office consistently maintains one of the highest abuse and neglect caseloads.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Tenth Judicial Circuit**

Under the direction of our five-member Board of Directors, the Tenth Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation is a client focused non-profit corporation operating in the southern coalfields of West Virginia. Founded in 1989 it is one of the oldest Public Defender Corporations in the State of West Virginia. Our office represents clients before the four judges and five magistrates in Raleigh County. We also represent clients before three mental hygiene commissioners and the State of West Virginia Parole Board due to our proximity to the Southern Regional Jail. We employ nine attorneys, and eight non-attorney staff members.

### **Change at the Top**

During this fiscal year, we said goodbye to former Chief Public Defender, Wilbert A. Payne as he celebrated his well-deserved retirement in April of 2021. That same month, our Board of Directors named Stacey L. Fragile, as Chief Public Defender. We also hired Mackenzie C. Hardin as an assistant public defender. Mackenzie joins Kris N. Kostenko, Robert D. Goldberg, Joshua D. Brown and Benjamin J. Olsen. At the close of the Fiscal Year our office had three vacancies for assistant public defenders. Two of those vacancies are filled by Madison Birchfield and Oliver Keene, who are practicing under Rule 10 Licenses as we anxiously await their Bar Examination results. Combined our attorneys have over 80 years of experience in the practice of law. Further, prior to joining this office, our attorneys worked in state government as agency heads and assistant prosecutors, as private panel attorneys, as civil defense attorneys, as plaintiff's attorneys, and as in-house counsel for large private corporations.

### **Core Staff Superstars**

Our core staff is the grease that keeps the gears of the office running smoothly. Kelsey Almond and Theresa Jordan are our current legal assistants, while Reagan Stewart is our receptionist, Alice McClure is our case coordinator, and Lou Briguglio fills the all-important role of bookkeeper and office technology manager. Our office currently has vacancies for one legal assistant and a peer recovery coach.

### **By the Numbers**

In FY2021, even in the middle of a pandemic and a partial court shutdown, we opened 2,567 cases and we closed 2,477 cases. Of that number, 735 were felonies, 1,101 were misdemeanors, 220 were mental hygiene matters, 106 were juvenile matters, 150 were parole revocation matters, 67 were probation revocation matters, 7 were abuse and neglect cases, and 91 "other" cases. Each attorney handled an average of 297 cases last fiscal year. Heading into FY 2022, our office has an open case load of 1,779 as of June 30, 2021.

**Each of these cases represents someone's mother, father, sister, brother, son, or daughter and we work every day to ensure that our clients feel like more than just a name or number.**

While these numbers are more than the American Bar Associations recommendations, the attorneys of the 10<sup>th</sup> work diligently to represent each client equally and to the absolute best of our ability. Our entire office works together, and all members have an open-door policy for collaboration and support. When trial time comes, it is all hands-on deck at this office with

everyone offering support, encouragement, or just a friendly ear to vent the day's frustrations.

### **Community Involvement**

At this office we believe in giving back to the community because we not only work in Raleigh County, the majority of us live here with our families. To that end, our office members volunteer with many organizations including Girl Scouts, youth sports, community corrections, prevention coalitions, afterschool programs, WV Indigent Defense Commission, and local dance companies. On any given day you can find one of our members out in the community giving back and working to make the places where we live and work a better place.

Further, our Chief Public Defender meets weekly with one circuit court judge, a representative from the county prosecutor's office, representatives from the county commission, LEAD, veteran's affairs, and the day report center in an effort to assist our clients even further by taking steps to release them from pre-trial incarceration and working to reduce the county jail bill so that the money that would be used to pay for pre-trial incarceration can instead be put to use on other community initiatives by the county commission.

### **Conclusion**

While the job of a public defender is not a glamorous one and will likely never lead to fame or fortune, those who have committed themselves to defending the rights of those who are less fortunate than us deserve far more recognition and remuneration that they will ever receive. The attorneys and staff of the 10<sup>th</sup> PDC it will continue to fight the good fight while ensuring that the rights of our indigent community members are protected from those who would seek to take those rights.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit**

FY21 has been the most challenging year yet for our office. We have continued to serve our clients throughout the Covid-19 pandemic and a period of rapid change in the legal system. The office did transition to work from home during the height of the pandemic, but due to the staff's dedication and adherence to the safety protocols was never closed or quarantined. One of the changes was the shift to remote court conducted through Microsoft Teams. The office was able to obtain a subscription to Teams (as well as other Microsoft services) at no cost through a donation from Microsoft. This has allowed us to acclimate clients to the Teams environment prior to hearings as well as have video meetings with clients.

In addition to adding Teams, we switched to a cloud-based phone system which allows clients to call the office and be connected to their attorney (or a staff member) regardless of the attorney's location. The cloud-based system also resulted in an increase in efficiency by allowing one staff member serve as the receptionist for both offices (Lewisburg and Marlinton). As challenging as the last two years have been, these changes will allow us to be more prepared for the future and better serve our clients in the present.

The attorneys and staff are:

### ***Joshua L. Edwards, Chief Public Defender***

Joshua Edwards has been the Chief Public Defender in the 11<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit since 2011. Prior to his appointment as Chief Public Defender, Mr. Edwards served as the Deputy Chief Defender and an Assistant Public Defender assigned to Pocahontas County. In addition to managing the office and supervising the seven other staff members, Mr. Edwards maintains a full caseload. He is currently covering all Pocahontas County cases as well as focusing on Juvenile Cases in Greenbrier County. Mr. Edwards also assist the other attorneys in serious felonies and handles post-conviction remedies. Mr. Edwards is a frequent presenter at continuing legal education classes and presented this year at the West Virginia Criminal Justice Reform Summit on Juvenile Justice.

Mr. Edwards believes in public service and feels privileged to serve his community everyday through his efforts as a Public Defender. Additionally, Mr. Edwards serves on the Community Corrections Board for Greenbrier County and frequently contributes to efforts to improve the legal system. He just completed a term as a member of the City of Lewisburg's City Council and currently serves on the City's Parks Commission.

Mr. Edwards sought appointment to the Parks Commission after having become heavily involved in the local mountain biking community through the Greenbrier County Hellbenders Youth Mountain Bike Team which he helped to found. Steve noted, "It has been one of the better times of my life, working on the front lines where the problems are, and sometimes being able to solve a few. ## **Public Defender Corporation for the Twelfth Judicial Circuit**

When considering the narrative for this year my first thought was to write about the WONDERFUL addition to our office, Kate Arritt. However, this has been such a troubling year, it didn't feel right.

I considered that the purpose of the narrative is to outline the work we do as part of our employment and the community activities we engage in as active citizens. This year we saw the implementation of TEEN COURT, which E. Scott Stanton has taken on for our office and Family Treatment Court which I handle. The opportunities to participate in Community activities were limited and although some did occur, so, that didn't feel right either.

Then I thought about having our pets do the narrative. Scott and I own cats; the rest of the office are dog owners. I pictured adding heartwarming pictures of pets enjoying the extra time with their person, maybe sitting on files or being seen during TEAMS hearings. The pets declined, they didn't like this past year either, it was too tense and their owners were too stressed.

So why was it so tense and stressful?

Obviously COVID changed how our workload was handled. Hearings were held by video which added stress because we were not with our clients, making it impossible to discreetly communicate with them during hearings. Jail and prison visits were limited and when available were 'no contact', making it difficult to review discovery with clients or even have them sign paperwork. Multidisciplinary team meetings were held by telephone, making it impossible to gauge a client's non-verbal behaviors.

COVID also compressed our case load. For a period, jury trials just were not possible so those cases which could not be easily resolved got backed up. Then, because the May 2020 Grand Jury met a month late, there was less time to resolve cases within the term of court leading to many carryovers. The next Grand Jury met timely but because of the carryovers there were a stressful number of cases that needed to be worked toward resolution. The next Grand Jury was once again delayed. It became a vicious cycle.

COVID limited the services we could get for our clients. Parents in Abuse and Neglect actions for could only 'see' their children on video for long periods of time. When visits did start, our clients had to be masked and remain at least six feet from their children. Parenting and Adult Life skill services were done by telephone. AA and NA meetings were done online. Clients who needed in-patient care for substance abuse were delayed because various centers were locked down for being COVID positive. If a client was fortunate enough to obtain a bed in a treatment facility, they had to spend two weeks in quarantine.

COVID put our own health and the health of our loved ones at risk. We have to meet with our clients, we have to go into jails and prisons, we have to visit juvenile facilities and

treatment centers. We were quarantined. Three of us were positive at once. Members of our families were quarantined. This not only had a real impact on our lives, but also impacted clients. We can't represent clients when we're down with COVID.

Sadly, at least one client suffered the ultimate direct impact of COVID when they died while in custody. It also indirectly led to the death of many clients. I am finishing this narrative on International Overdose Awareness Day. The isolation of COVID (and the interruption of services it caused) contributed to many clients overdosing.

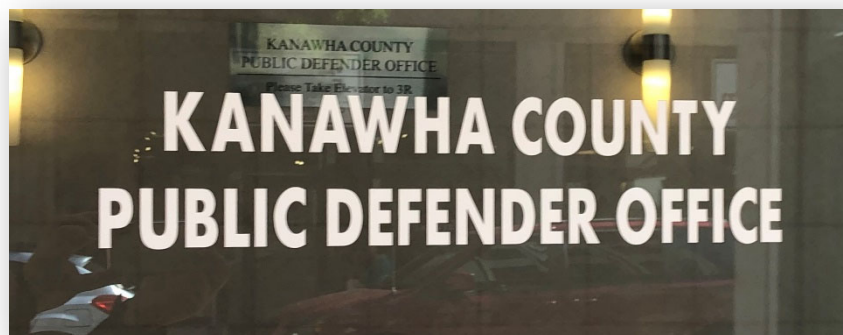
It tears at us when any case is dismissed because the 'client died.'

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Thirteenth Judicial Circuit**

Having opened in 1989, the Kanawha County Public Defender Office has spent close to thirty-two years providing high quality legal representation to indigent persons charged with crimes in Kanawha County by protecting their freedoms and rights, zealously advocating for their liberty, and promoting the fair administration of justice.

The office currently employs twenty-three fulltime lawyers and one part-time senior counsel. The core staff consists of fifteen regular full-time employees and one SWIFT defense social worker, who provides intervention for women impacted by the

criminal justice system. The office appears in Charleston and South Charleston Municipal, Kanawha County Magistrate, and Circuit courts, representing clients charged with felonies, misdemeanors, and juvenile delinquency. Our attorneys also represent clients in involuntary commitment proceedings, contempt proceedings, and sit on both the Juvenile and Adult Drug Court teams.

This year, we opened 5,084 new cases. While our primary responsibility is to our clients facing the loss of their liberty, we are involved in making our community fair and just for all of those impacted by the criminal legal system. Kanawha County Public Defenders are active in the legal community, serving as committee and board members and as faculty for continuing legal education providers. The Chief Public Defender chairs the West Virginia Sentencing Commission, a subcommittee of the Governor's Committee on Crime, Delinquency, and Correction. Members of our legal staff participate in national and West Virginia DUI defense lawyer associations and are on the faculties of the Public Defender College hosted by the Kentucky Department of Public Advocacy and Gideon's Promise, a national public defender training organization, and conduct training locally and statewide on various legal topics.

Like everyone else, we faced challenges during the COVID-19 pandemic. We quickly adjusted to the difficulty of defending our clients under unprecedented circumstances, including working with the local regional jail to arrange video conferencing with our incarcerated clients. We worked with national organizations to develop best practices, and conducted state wide training for other public defenders and private counsel regarding representing clients during a pandemic. We continued to zealously represent our clients. We collaborated with private attorneys and Public Defender Services in litigation regarding the

availability of good-time credit for defendants serving time for violations of supervised release. Despite the pandemic, our office participated in four jury trials held using COVID protocols to protect all participants.

Members of our support team are also active in criminal justice outreach and reform, being active members of the WV Criminal Law Reform Coalition, acting as members of the Kanawha County Reentry Council, helping our clientele with barriers they face integrating back into society after incarceration, and advocating before the legislature for the passage of legislation beneficial to current and former incarcerated people. In addition to their legal work, our employees are involved in many activities in service to their community.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-third Judicial Circuit**

The Mission of the Eastern Panhandle Public Defender Office (EPPDO) is to provide competent, thoroughly professional legal representation to the indigent criminally accused in all Courts in the Twenty-third (23rd) Judicial Circuit of West Virginia in an efficient, cost-effective manner when appointed to do so by competent judicial authority.

Our clientele primarily consists of defendants in criminal matters at the felony and misdemeanor levels in Circuit and Magistrate Court, but the obligation to provide professional, competent legal representation extends to and includes appointments to represent offending respondents in parental rights termination matters ("abuse and neglect" cases), Family Law Court contempt proceedings, juvenile offender matters and mental hygiene involuntary commitment proceedings, as well as appellate matters at various levels when assigned to do so by a Court, to include prosecuting appeals in the WV Supreme Court of Appeals.

The EPPDO office responsibilities include all the courts in all three county jurisdictions in the Eastern Panhandle (Berkeley, Jefferson and Morgan), as well as seven individual municipal courts in various towns throughout the Panhandle, particularly Martinsburg's Municipal Court. Our two separate offices are located in Martinsburg, which covers all matters in Berkeley and Morgan counties, and a satellite office in Charles Town, which handles all matters in Jefferson County.

Established nearly thirty years ago and operating continuously since, we are the second largest Public Defender Corporation in West Virginia with a staff of 33 individuals: 20 licensed attorneys and 13 clerical support staff members and investigators. The team at the EPPDO is a committed, dedicated crew, truly devoted to ensuring that our clients of all types are treated justly: we fiercely protect the rights of poor, often powerless and are somehow enmeshed in other legal difficulties touching upon fundamental rights, thus ensuring that the criminal justice system is administered fairly, remains open, accessible and even-handed -- and is perceived as such by the general public and citizenry that we serve. We ensure that the everyday-person accused of wrongdoing by a powerful government and police apparatus is not overwhelmed and unduly intimidated and that his or her voice and "side of the story" is told by a tenacious, professional advocate committed to his or her cause. As Chief Public Defender, and a veteran of nearly twenty years in the trenches at the EPPDO, I am supremely confident that we are well-regarded and respected by all the judges and opposing counsel in our bailiwick. We are the proverbial "overworked and underpaid" public servants: despite staggering caseloads —well above and greatly surpassing ABA guideline levels - and extremely low compensation relative to our peers in the local prosecutors' offices, we enjoy very low turnover among the staff and have accrued a level of experience and expertise unrivaled in the State: a devoted team of career Public Defenders serving the State and her people and Courts.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-fifth Judicial Circuit**

The Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-Fifth Judicial Circuit serves both Boone and Lincoln counties. The combined effort of six attorneys and four office support staff is credited with closing approximately twelve-hundred cases annually. Each client, however, presents a unique set of circumstances and our offices work diligently to provide individualized and effective legal representation to all. Enough cannot be said for the tremendous effort and determination our folks put forth each and every day.

The past fiscal year, nevertheless, presented novel challenges to the representation of indigent clients - court closures, jail quarantines, and online virtual hearings just to name a few. These obstacles—sometimes small hurdles and other times blockades to justice—were met with fortitude by our staff. It has been said that hard work may be a prison sentence only if it has no meaning. Without question, criminal defense amid a pandemic is hard work. Even so, our dedicated defenders found necessary meaning in zealously protecting the rights and health of those incarcerated.

At present, our corporation operates offices in both Boone and Lincoln counties. The Lincoln County office, situated in Hamlin, is staffed by two attorneys and one secretary. David Lockwood, senior Lincoln County defender and nineteen-year member of the team, focuses primarily on felony cases, bringing considerable trial experience to the court room. The most recent addition to our staff, Frank Curnutte, directs his attention to all misdemeanor and abuse/neglect clients and lends a hand in various felony matters. Support staff needs in the Lincoln County office are fulfilled by Delena Toler and Crissey Ryan. The two divide their attention weekly between the Madison and Hamlin offices. Delena and Crissey demonstrate their dedication, commuting from Madison to Hamlin every other week, in support of our Lincoln County clients and Hamlin based attorneys.

The Boone County Office, situated on Main Street in Madison, staffs four attorneys, two secretaries, one office manager, and one recovery coach. The senior attorney in our Madison office, Howard Nolen, joined the Corporation in 2005. He presently manages all misdemeanor cases appointed to our Boone office. With years of experience, Howard is astute in negotiating favorable pleas and fostering alternative resolutions in magistrate court. Troy Adams joined the corporation as Chief Public Defender in 2016. Since then, he has focused his attention on felony cases, restructuring office operating procedures, and increasing the availability of mental health services to clients. Kassie Ball joined the Boone office in 2019. Kassie's primary focus comprises abuse/neglect, juvenile matters, and mental hygiene proceedings, but eagerly takes on any additional cases sent her way. Katie Murray joined the defender's office in November of 2020. Katie's strong research and writing skills have quickly proven assets to the office in numerous felony matters. In their first jury trial, Kassie and Katie recently limited conviction to misdemeanor simple possession, while achieving an acquittal on the accompanying felony charge of child neglect risking serious bodily injury or death.

Our Madison office support staff consists of Kathy Lane, Jeanna Woodrum, Delena Toler, and Crissey Ryan. Kathy Lane, our Office Manager, is a ten-year member of the Madison team. Her office know-how and winning attitude are both readily apparent. When questions and obstacles arise, Kathy brings answers and solutions. Jeanna Woodrum entered the Boone office in 2012. Alongside Kathy, she takes on behind the scenes tasks to equip our attorneys for court. In 2019, Mallory Sutphin, previously a part-time, grant-funded recovery coach in the Madison office, earned a full-time recovery coach position serving Boone, Lincoln, Cabell, and Wayne County PDCs. We are enthusiastic that clients have an opportunity to benefit from her extensive knowledge in substance use disorder and recovery. Mallory was recently recognized for achievements in her field, receiving both the 2020 PDS Guild Award and 2021 WVAADC New Frontier Award.

Our Board of Directors includes Tony Hensley, Jim Gore, Wendle Cook, and Phoebe Harless. Beyond his commitment to the Corporation, our Chairman, Tony Hensley, operates a family-owned hardware store in Danville, is Vice-President of the Boone Memorial Hospital Board of Directors, and is a member of the Danville Town Council. Jim Gore, with over thirty years of managerial experience in the private sector and county administration, brings practical knowledge to the corporation. Jim is also appointed to the Boone Memorial Hospital Board of Directors. Wendle Cook manages the Cook and Cook Law Firm in Madison where he has practiced law for thirty years. Our newest member, Phoebe Harless, is a member of the Lincoln County Commission.

## **Public Defender Corporation for the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit**

The 28th Judicial Circuit Public Defender Corporation in Summersville was established in 1983 as the first public defender corporation in the state.

From 1983 to 1987 D. Mark Snyder was the sole practitioner and public defender for the Circuit. In October of 1987, Cynthia Stanton was hired as the Public Defender and held that position for 34 years making her the longest serving Public Defender in the State. Ms. Stanton was the only public defender in Nicholas County for the first 7 years of her tenure. In 1994 a decision in Charleston was made to hire an assistant public defender to work with Ms. Stanton and in the last twenty-two years, there have been eight different attorneys who have held that. Kathleen Murphy was hired in 2019 as an Assistant to handle abuse and neglect proceedings and juvenile matters. She was promoted to Chief Public Defender in January 2021 when Ms. Stanton retired.

Joe Mosko joined our office shortly thereafter and handles abuse and neglect and juvenile proceedings while Ms. Murphy handles the criminal docket of the Court. The 28th PDC also has two administrative assistants, Kathy O'Dell and Theresa Cartwright. Ms. O'Dell has worked in the office for twenty-four years and serves as the office manager. Theresa Cartwright began working for our corporation in 2015 bringing with her years of legal experience.

Since its inception, the 28th PDC has maintained an annual caseload of approximately 500-600 cases per year. This office has been responsible for indigent representation in all areas of criminal defense. Our two attorneys handle 73% of all criminal cases where defendants meet the income requirements for Court appointed counsel. Additionally, this office is responsible for representing clients in mental hygiene and Family Court Proceedings.

The 28th Circuit has a Drug Court, Family Treatment Court, and Teen Court programs. The Chief Public Defender supports these programs and actively participates in them. Kathleen Murphy sits on the Drug Court Team while Mr. Mosko is an integral part of the Family Treatment Court Team. In addition, Ms. Murphy serves on the Community Corrections Board for the Nicholas County Day Report Center as well as the Board of a local treatment facility. Ms. Murphy and Mr. Mosko regularly participate in the Teen Court initiatives and work in cooperation with the Nicholas County Probation Department and the Board of Education to help meet the needs of at-risk teens and children in our communities.

We have always had each attorney prepared and ready to conduct any kind of criminal or civil proceeding. We take great pride in serving the citizens of Nicholas County and we look forward to growing our office to meet the needs of our clients and the citizenry of Nicholas County.

## Public Defender Services announces recipients of annual awards

Public Defender Services (PDS) recently announced the 2020 recipients of its annual awards.

The recipients of these awards, which recognize individuals exhibiting excellence in a public defender setting, are typically announced during the agency's annual Indigent Defense Conference.

Although the conference was cancelled this year due to the ongoing pandemic, PDS recognizes that work has continued as shown by the outstanding efforts made in the past year by Teresa McCune, L. Scott Briscoe, Lida Shepherd and Mallory Sutphin.

McCune and Briscoe are co-recipients of the 2020 John A. "Jack" Rogers Award for Outstanding Leadership in Public Service. The award is named for Jack Rogers, who crafted the legislation creating Public Defender Services in 1989 and who then served as its executive director for more than 20 years.

McCune retired in 2019 after 29 years as the public defender for the 30th Judicial Circuit in West Virginia covering Mingo County. She led her office by example, representing her clients in legal proceedings but also advocating for their personal needs, including treatment, counseling and education.

McCune graduated from Marshall University with a degree in international affairs and received her law degree from Antioch School of Law in Washington, D.C.

“Teresa was not just an attorney,” said PDS Executive Director Dana Eddy. “She was, and remains, an advocate for her clients, her employees and her community. Teresa not only wanted things to change for the better; she made them change.”

In addition to her service as a public defender, McCune served on numerous committees for the West Virginia State Bar as well as on its Board of Governors and was an active member of the state’s Indigent Defense Commission.

Briscoe practices law in Danville, West Virginia, where he takes appointments from the circuit courts to represent individuals in criminal proceedings who cannot afford to pay for legal counsel.

Briscoe, a graduate of the West Virginia University College of Law, was recently featured in the Washington Post for his representation as the guardian ad litem of a child mired in the juvenile justice system.

In the article, Briscoe was praised for his counseling of the young child, which extended beyond legal advice and provided guidance and inspiration for the child to use his artistic talent. On the day the child was released from the state’s custody and announced his intent to become a tattoo artist, he referred to Briscoe as his “champion.”

Shepherd was the recipient of the 2020 Award for Outstanding Scholarship in Criminal Law, and Sutphin was the recipient of the 2020 GUILD Award.

Public Defender Services thanked each of these recipients for their commitment and dedication to the betterment of the public defender field. A virtual presentation of the awards will be made at a later date, according to the release.

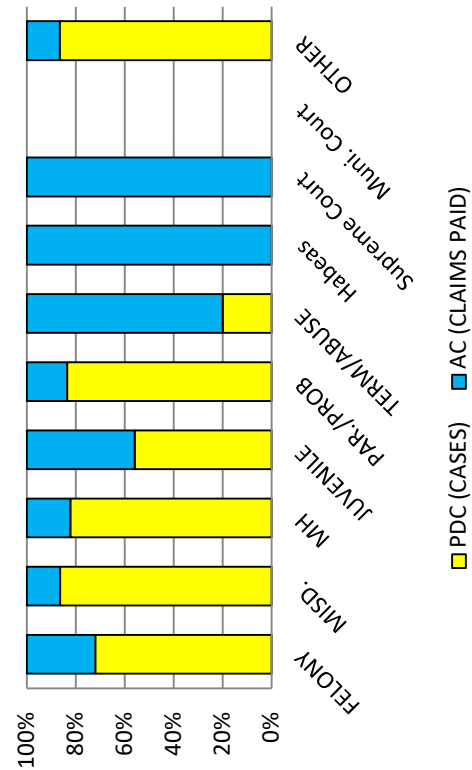

During the two-hour interrogation, Miranda allegedly confessed to committing the crimes, which the police apparently recorded. Miranda, who had not finished ninth grade and had a history of mental instability, had no counsel present. At trial, the prosecution's case consisted solely of his confession.\**
